HOUSING: Housing will be critical during Inauguration week. In view of the numbers coming from all over the Country, there simply are not enough rooms to accommodate everyone. It is important that this be done immediately in order to reserve the rooms that you want. For those Members who do not have any connections with Washington hotels we will be very glad to undertake to arrange for suitable accommodations. Again, if you would like us to do this, please send us the necessary information by Sunday, December 13, 1964.

Set out below are the various requirements imposed by the Washington Hotel Association:

- Reservations must be for 4 days, from January 17 through January 20, 1965.
- No reservations will be made after January 1. We strongly urge, however, that the reservations be made immediately.
- All reservations must be made in the name of the individual or individuals who will occupy the room.
- 4. If we make the reservation for you, the hotel will notify you directly of your accommodation and you will make your payment directly to the hotel following this notification. Please do not send any money for hotels to this office.

INAUGURAL CEREMONY: The swearing-in of President Johnson and Vice President Humphrey, and the President's Inaugural Address, will commence at 11:30 a.m. Wednesday, January 20, 1965, at the East Front of the United States Capitol. A limited number of seats is available through the Joint Congressional Inaugural Committee, and we will make every effort to secure admission for The President's Club Members.

INAUGURAL PARADE: The Parade will begin at 1:30 p.m. when the President leaves the Capitol and proceeds down Pennsylvania Avenue to the White House. We have reserved a section of grand-stand seats on Pennsylvania Avenue opposite the White House for President's Club Members. There will be a charge of \$15.00 for each seat.

INAUGURAL BALL: Will be held the evening of Wednesday, January 20th. Tickets for the Ball will cost \$25.00 per person.

INAUGURAL AUTOMOBILE LICENSE PLATES: We have reserved a series of low number Inaugural Plates for President's Club Members. We are enclosing a descriptive brochure with tear-out form.
