FORTY YEARS AGO,
MINNESOTA'S ECONOMY WAS BASED
LARGELY ON AGRICULTURE, AND WE
REMAIN A VERY IMPORTANT
AGRICULTURAL STATE. BUT MUCH
HAS CHANGED SINCE THEN. WE
ARE HERE TO DESCRIBE THE
MODERN MINNESOTA -- A MODERN
SOPHISTICATED, ADVANCED
ECONOMY, WITH MANY ATTRACTIVE

WE ALSO WANT TO LET YOU KNOW HOW MINNESOTA CAN ASSIST YOU. MINNESOTA IS SENSITIVE TO THE NEEDS OF FOREIGN INVESTORS. WE OFFER A COMPREHENSIVE PROGRAM OF

STRENGTHS.

SERVICES FOR YOU. WE WANT TO BECOME YOUR LONG-TERM PARTNER.

ONE NEEDS SUCH PARTNERS IN BUSINESS TODAY. AS YOU ALL KNOW, TECHNOLOGY AND MODERN COMMUNICATION HAVE CRUMBLED THE BARRIERS OF NATIONALITY AND LANGUAGE, GIVING RISE TO A COMPLEX GLOBAL ECONOMY. AS THE PRESIDENT OF THE NECCORPORATION PUT IT: THE WORLD HAS ENTERED THE AGE OF "THE BORDERLESS ECONOMY."

BECOME INTERDEPENDANT. THE LONDON AND TOKYO EXCHANGES FOUND NO ESCAPE FROM THE SHOCK WAVES OF THE U.S. STOCK MARKETS CRASH. LAST OCTOBER. IN THE AFTERMATH, AMERICANS AWAKENED ANXIOUSLY EACH MORNING TO HEAR ABOUT THE NIKKEI-DOW AS AN INDICATION OF WHAT THE U.S. MARKETS MIGHT DO THAT DAY.

NO DOUBT, YOU ARE PAINFULLY AWARE THESE DAYS OF THE TIES BETWEEN THE YEN AND THE DOLLAR.

JAPAN, OF COURSE, IS READILY ADAPTING TO THE GLOBAL ECONOMY, I UNDERSTAND THERE IS MUCH TALK IN YOUR COUNTRY TODAY ABOUT THE INTERNATIONALIZATION OF JAPAN. NUMBER OF YOUR PEOPLE LIVING OR VISITING FOREIGN LANDS HAS DOUBLED FROM /// 10 YEARS; ACO. YOUR INTERNATIONAL COMMUNICATIONS HAVE INCREASED FIVEFOLD; THE AMOUNT OF MANUFACTURING | JAPAN DOES OUTSIDE ITS OWN BORDERS WILL DOUBLE BY 1990 TO EQUAL 8.7% OF YOUR GROSS NATIONAL PRODUCT.

THIS GLOBAL ECONOMY, NO TWO NATION'S HAVE BECOME MORE CLOSELY LINKED THAN THE UNITED STATES AND JAPAN. THERE IS NO PRECEDENT FOR OUR

PARTNERSHIP.

WHILE WE HAVE WYDELY DIFFERENT HISTORICAL, CULTURAL AND LINGUISTIC ROOTS, YET, FROM THE ASHES OF A DISASTROUS CONFLICT, WE HAVE FORGED ONE OF THE MOST PRODUCTIVE BILATERAL RELATIONSHIPS THE WORLD HAS EVER KNOWN. OUR TWO COUNTRIES, ACCOUNT FOR ONE—THIRD OF THE WORLD'S GNP.

WE EXCHANGE \$100 BILLION WORTH OF GOODS A YEAR. BUT WE NOT ONLY DO BUSINESS ACROSS EACH OTHER'S BORDERS. WE DO BUSINESS WITHIN EACH OTHER'S BORDERS AS WELL. AMERICAN FIRMS ARE PRODUCING \$50 BILLION WORTH OF GOODS IN JAPAN. JAPANESE FIRMS NOW EMPLOY SOME 250,000 AMERICANS IN THE U.S.

IN FINANCE, NINETEEN U.S. WALL STREET FIRMS HAVE OFFICES IN TOKYO. AND JAPAN'S BIG

FOUR BROKERAGE HOUSES -INCLUDING NOMURA, OUR HOST
TODAY -- REGULARLY SERVE U.S.
CUSTOMERS. THE MINNESOTA
STATE PENSION FUND. IS AMONG
THEM.

OUR TWO NATIONS ARE JOINING FORCES IN AN INCREASING NUMBER OF JOINT VENTURES. THE ENDEAVORS RANGE FROM AUTOS TO COMPUTERS TO ROBOTS. GENERAL MOTORS IS HAS LINKED HANDS WITH TOYOTA; CHRYSLER MITSUBISHI, TOSHIBA HAS TEAMED UP WITH MOTOROLA. JUST A FEW WEEKS AGO BRIDGESTONE CORP. OF JAPAN BOUGHT A 75% STAKE IN THE FIRESTONE TIRE AND RUBBER COMPANY, MAKING / JAPAN'S LARGEST INVESTMENT. IN AN MANUFACTURING AMERICAN CONCERN.

AS A FORMER MINISTER OF FOREIGN AFFAIRS HAS OBSERVED: JAPAN AND THE U.S. HAVE PASSED

THE STAGE OF INTERDEPENDENCE; OUR ECONOMICS ARE MOVING TOWARD INTEGRATION.

BUT A WORD OF CAUTION.

NO OTHER NATION ALLOWS
UNCONTROLLED FOREIGN
INVESTMENT TO THE EXTENT THAT
THE UNITED STATES DOES.
FOREIGN INVESTMENT IN AMERICA
TODAY IS ESTIMATED AT \$1.5
TRILLION. DIRECT FOREIGN
PURCHASES OF U.S. COMPANIES
GREW BY MORE THAN 50% LAST
YEAR ALONE.

THIS UNPRECEDENTED SURGE IS CREATING A BACKLASH. THERE ARE THOSE IN THE UNITED STATES WHO ARE CALLING FOR LAWS TO PUT CERTAIN TYPES OF FOREIGN INVESTMENTS THROUGH A REVIEW PROCESS. AS YOU KNOW, SOME OF THE NOISE AND CLATTER IS OFTEN AIMED DIRECTLY AT YOU. BUT THE ROOTS OF THESE CONCERNS ARE TO BE FOUND ELSEWHERE. THE U.S. ECONOMY

HAS GONE THROUGH WRENCHING CHANGES DURING THE 1980S. WHY? WE CREATED MASSIVE BUDGET DEFICITS AND A VASTLY OVER-VALUED DOLLAR WHICH DEVASTATED INDUSTRIAL AND RURAL AMERICA. WE MUST UNDERSTAND THAT DESPERATE PEOPLE WHO HAVE LOST THEIR FARMS, THEIR JOBS, OR THEIR BUSINESS ØFTEN, AND UNDERSTANDABLY, SPEAK FROM DESPAIR, EVEN RAGE. THIS DEFICIT IS NOT YOUR FAULT. IN FACT YOU HAVE PLEADED WITH US TO REDUCE IT TØ HEALTHY PROPORTION 5.

BUT BECAUSE OUR ECONOMIES ARE SO INTEGRATED, AS FRIENDS, WE MUST FACE THESE SOMETIMES UNPLEASANT REALITIES TOGETHER.

NEVERTHELESS, I AM SURE OUR TIES WILL CONTINUE TO GROW. AND YOUR LINKS WITH AMERICA WILL NOT BE CONFINED JUST TO THE U.S. COASTS.

Coosele hustines us

YOU HAVE ALREADY COME TO REALIZE THE STRENGTH OF AMERICA'S HEARTLAND. SOME 700 JAPANESE FIRMS HAVE OFFICES IN THE MIDWEST. AND FOR GOOD REASON. THE REGION OFFERS PROXIMITY TO ROUGHLY 65% OF AMERICA'S POPULATION AND MANUFACTURING BASE. AND NOW ITS SIZABLE MANUFACTURING AND AGRICULTURAL SECTORS ARE STAGING A COMEBACK.

I AM PLEASED TO SAY THAT JAPAN AND MINNESOTA HAVE MANY CLOSE AND LONG-ESTABLISHED BONDS AS WELL. 3M COMPANY AND HONEYWELL, TWO MINNESOTA TECHNOLOGICAL GIANTS, WERE AMONG THE FIRST U.S. FIRMS TO ESTABLISH JAPANESE JOINT VENTURES. 3M-SU-MI-TO-MU AND YA-MA-TA-KE-HONEYWELL HAVE BEEN SHOW-CASES OF SUCCESSFUL U.S.-JAPAN BUSINESS COOPERATION.

JAPANESE AND MINNESOTA
FIRMS CONTINUE TO SPAWN SUCH
EFFORTS. JUST LAST MONTH, A
MINNESOTA FIRM, GNB INC., AND
JAPAN STORAGE BATTERY AGREED
TO MAKE STORAGE BATTERIES IN
THE U.S. NEC HAS JOINED WITH
HONEYWELL TO SELL SUPERCOMPUTERS IN THE U.S. LAST
YEAR, NEC INVESTED IN A THREEWAY PARTNERSHIP TO OPERATE
HONEYWELL'S FORMER COMPUTER
MANUFACTURING BUSINESS.

MINNESOTA COMPANIES
CONTINUE TO BE ACTIVE IN JAPAN
AS WELL. TWENTY-FIVE
MINNESOTA FIRMS HAVE OFFICES
BASED IN TOKYO. A NUMBER OF
THEM WILL BE REPRESENTED AT
OUR RECEPTION.

JAPAN HAS A DIRECT PRESENCE IN MINNESOTA TOO. TWENTY JAPANESE FIRMS, COVERING A VARIETY OF INDUSTRIES AND SERVICES, HAVE LOCATED IN MINNESOTA.

--KAH-JI-MA CONSTRUCTION
IS A FIRM THAT MY FRIEND AND
MENTOR, FORMER MINNESOTA
SENATOR AND U.S. VICE
PRESIDENT HUBERT HUMPHREY, HAD
A KEY ROLE IN BRINGING TO
MINNESOTA. KAH-JI-MA HAS BEEN
WORKING IN PARTNERSHIP WITH
THE CITY OF MINNEAPOLIS TO
DEVELOP A STRETCH OF CITY LAND
ALONG THE HISTORIC
MISSISSIPPPI RIVER.

--COPAL SYSTEMS IS THE LARGEST JAPANESE EMPLOYER IN MINNESOTA. THE FIRM MAKES ONE-HOUR PHOTO PROCESSING MACHINES. IT HOLDS 25 PER CENT OF THE U.S. MARKET FOR SUCH EQUIPMENT. LATER IN THE PROGRAM, MR. SHE-MAH-MURA OF COPAL WILL TELL YOU ABOUT HIS SUCCESSFUL RELATIONSHIP WITH MINNESOTA AND ITS WORK FORCE.

--PENTAX OPTHALMIC, A DIVISION OF ASAHI OPTICAL,

PRODUCES SPECIAL COATINGS FOR EYEGLASSES AND OPTICAL PIECES IN MINESOTA. IT SELECTED MINNESOTA BECAUSE OUR STATE IS A LEADER IN THE U.S. OPTICS MARKET. THREE OF THE TOP FIVE U.S. OPTICS FIRMS ARE LOCATED IN THE STATE.

WE EXCHANGE \$100 BILLION WORTH OF GOODS A YEAR. BUT WE NOT ONLY DO BUSINESS ACROSS EACH OTHER'S BORDERS. WE DO BUSINESS WITHIN EACH OTHER'S BORDERS AS WELL. AMERICAN FIRMS ARE PRODUCING \$50 BILLION WORTH OF GOODS INSIDE OF JAPAN.

JAPANESE FIRMS NOW EMPLOY SOME 250,000 AMERICANS IN THE U.S.

IN FINANCE, NINETEEN U.S. WALL STREET FIRMS HAVE OFFICES HERE IN TOKYO. AND JAPAN'S BIG FOUR BROKERAGE HOUSES
-- INCLUDING NOMURA, OUR HOST TODAY -- REGULARLY SERVE U.S.
CUSTOMERS. THE MINNESOTA STATE PENSION FUND IS AMONG THEM.

OUR TWO NATION'S ARE JOINING FORCES IN AN INCREASING NUMBER OF JOINT VENTURES. THE ENDEAVORS RANGE FROM AUTOS TO COMPUTERS TO ROBOTS, GENERAL MOTORS HAS LINKED HANDS WITH TOYOTA. TOSHIBA HAS TEAMED UP WITH MOTOROLA. JUST A FEW WEEKS AGO BRIDGESTONE CORP. OF JAPAN BOUGHT A 75% STAKE IN THE TIRE-MAKING OPERATIONS OF THE FIRESTONE TIRE AND RUBBER COMPANY. IT MARKED JAPAN'S LARGEST INVESTMENT EVER IN AN AMERICAN MANUFACTURING CONCERN.

AS YOUR FORMER MINISTER OF FOREIGN AFFAIRS, TAH-DAH-SHI KUR-A-NARI, HAS OBSERVED: JAPAN AND THE U.S. HAVE PASSED THE STAGE OF INTERDEPENDENCE. OUR ECONOMIES ARE MOVING TOWARD INTEGRATION.

BUT A WORD OF CAUTION. NO OTHER NATION ALLOWS UNCONTROLLED FOREIGN INVESTMENT TO THE EXTENT THAT THE UNITED
STATES DOES. FOREIGN INVESTMENT IN AMERICA TODAY IS
ESTIMATED AT \$1.5 TRILLION. DIRECT FOREIGN PURCHASES OF U.S.
COMPANIES GREW BY MORE THAN 50% LAST YEAR ALONE.

THIS UNPRECEDENTED SURGE IS CREATING A BACKLASH. THERE ARE THOSE IN THE UNITED STATES WHO ARE CALLING FOR LAWS TO PUT CERTAIN TYPES OF FOREIGN INVESTMENTS THROUGH A REVIEW PROCESS. BUT YOU MUST BE AWARE OF THE BACKGROUND FROM WHICH SUCH REACTIONS ARISE.

AS YOU KNOW, MUCH OF THE NOISE AND CLATTER IS OFTEN
AIMED DIRECTLY AT YOU AS A FOREIGN NATION. BUT THE ROOTS OF
THESE CONCERNS ARE TO BE FOUND ELSEWHERE. THE U.S. ECONOMY
HAS GONE THROUGH WRENCHING CHANGES DURING THE 1980S. WE MUST
UNDERSTAND THAT DESPERATE PEOPLE WHO HAVE LOST THEIR FARMS,
THEIR FACTORY JOBS, OR THEIR BUSINESSES OFTEN, AND UNDERSTANDABLY, SPEAK FROM DESPAIR, EVEN RAGE. THIS IS NOT YOUR
FAULT.

BUT BECAUSE OUR ECONOMIES ARE SO INTEGRATED, WE WILL HAVE TO FACE THESE SOMETIMES UNPLEASANT REALITIES TOGETHER, AND AS CLOSE FRIENDS.

NEVERTHELESS, THE FORCES THAT CREATED THE GLOBAL ECONO-MY WILL PREVAIL. OUR TIES WILL CONTINUE TO GROW. AND YOUR LINKS WITH AMERICA WILL NOT BE JUST AT THE U.S. COASTS.

YOU HAVE ALREADY COME TO REALIZE THE STRENGTHS OF AMERICA'S HEARTLAND. SOME 700 JAPANESE FIRMS HAVE OFFICES IN THE MIDWEST. AND FOR GOOD REASON. THE REGION OFFERS PROXIMITY TO ROUGHLY 65% OF AMERICA'S POPULATION AND MANUFACTURING BASE.

AND NOW ITS SIZABLE MANUFACTURING AND AGRICULTURAL SECTORS

ARE STAGING A COMEBACK.

I AM PLEASED TO SAY THAT JAPAN AND MINNESOTA HAVE MANY CLOSE AND LONG-ESTABLISHED BONDS AS WELL. 3M COMPANY AND HONEYWELL, TWO MINNESOTA TECHNOLOGICAL GIANTS, WERE AMONG THE FIRST U.S. FIRMS TO ESTABLISH JAPANESE JOINT VENTURES.

3M--SU-MI-TO-MO AND YA-MA-TA-KE--HONEYWELL HAVE BEEN SHOW-CASES OF SUCCESSFUL U.S.-JAPAN BUSINESS COOPERATION.

JAPANESE AND MINNESOTA FIRMS CONTINUE TO SPAWN SUCH EFFORTS. JUST LAST MONTH, A MINNESOTA FIRM, GNB INC., AND

JAPAN STORAGE BATTERY AGREED TO MAKE STORAGE BATTERIES IN
THE U.S. NEC HAS JOINED WITH HONEYWELL TO SELL SUPERCOMPUTERS IN THE U.S. LAST YEAR, NEC INVESTED IN A THREE-WAY
PARTNERSHIP TO OPERATE HONEYWELL'S FORMER COMPUTER MANUFACTURING BUSINESS.

MINNESOTA COMPANIES CONTINUE TO BE ACTIVE IN JAPAN AS WELL. TWENTY-FIVE MINNESOTA FIRMS HAVE OFFICES BASED IN TOKYO. IT IS MY UNDERSTANDING THAT A NUMBER OF THEM WILL BE REPRESENTED AT THE RECEPTION FOLLOWING THIS SEMINAR.

JAPAN HAS A DIRECT PRESENCE IN MINNESOTA TOO. TWENTY

JAPANESE FIRMS, COVERING A VARIETY OF INDUSTRIES AND SER
VICES, HAVE LOCATED IN MINNESOTA.

- -- KAH-JI-MA CONSTRUCTION IS A FIRM THAT MY FRIEND AND MENTOR, FORMER MINNESOTA SENATOR AND U.S. VICE PRESIDENT HUBERT HUMPHREY, HAD A KEY ROLE IN BRINGING TO MINNESOTA. KAH-JI-MA HAS BEEN WORKING IN PARTNERSHIP WITH THE CITY OF MINNEAPOLIS TO DEVELOP A STRETCH OF CITY LAND ALONG THE HISTORIC MISSISSIPPI RIVER.
- -- COPAL SYSTEMS IS THE LARGEST JAPANESE EMPLOYER IN MINNESOTA. THE FIRM MAKES ONE-HOUR PHOTO PROCESSING MACHINES. IT HOLDS 25 PER CENT OF THE U.S. MARKET FOR SUCH EQUIPMENT. LATER IN THE PROGRAM, MR. SHE-MAH-MURA OF COPAL WILL TELL YOU ABOUT HIS SUCCESSFUL RELATIONSHIP WITH MINNESOTA AND ITS WORK FORCE.

- -- PENTAX OPTHALMIC, A DIVISION OF ASAHI OPTICAL IN TOKYO, PRODUCES SPECIAL COATINGS FOR EYEGLASSES AND OPTICAL PIECES AT A SUCCESSFUL MANUFACTURING FACILITY IN MINNESOTA. IT SELECTED MINNESOTA BECAUSE THE STATE IS A LEADER IN THE U.S. OPTICS MARKET. THREE OF THE TOP FIVE U.S. OPTICS FIRMS ARE LOCATED IN THE STATE.
- -- MITSUBISHI INTERNATIONAL, ONE OF THE LARGEST TRADING COMPANIES IN THE WORLD, OPENED AN OFFICE IN MINNEAPOLIS IN 1984 TO CAPITALIZE ON THE HIGH-TECH INDUSTRY IN MINNESOTA.

MINNESOTA AND JAPAN HAVE HAD AN ACTIVE TRADING RELA-TIONSHIP TOO. EVEN THOUGH IT BORDERS CANADA, MINNESOTA EX-PORTS MORE TO JAPAN THAN TO CANADA. YOUR NATION ACCOUNTED FOR 11% OF MINNESOTA'S EXPORT TRADE LAST YEAR.

MINNESOTA'S ROLE IN INTERNATIONAL BUSINESS IS NOT A

RECENT ONE. EVEN WHEN ITS ECONOMY DEPENDED MOST HEAVILY ON

FARMING, MINNESOTA WAS A MAJOR PLAYER IN INTERNATIONAL TRADE

AS HOME TO ONE OF THE WORLD'S BIGGEST GRAIN MERCHANTS.

MINNESOTA'S ECONOMY HAS BECOME MUCH MORE DIVERSIFIED SINCE THEN. IT HAS GIVEN BIRTH TO A MULTITUDE OF INTERNATIONAL COMPANIES. THE STATE HAS EMERGED AS A WORLD LEADER IN ELECTRONICS, MEDICAL TECHNOLOGY AND FOOD PROCESSING. MINNESOTA COMPANIES HAVE SPAWNED SOME OF THE MOST SIGNIFICANT INNOVATIONS OF THIS CENTURY, INCLUDING SCOTCH TAPE, CARDIAC PACEMAKERS AND SUPERCOMPUTERS.

THIS DIVERSITY AND WORLDWIDE REACH HAS MADE MINNESOTA'S ECONOMY ONE OF THE MOST IMPORTANT IN OUR COUNTRY. FOR YEARS NOW, ITS UNEMPLOYMENT RATE HAS BEEN BELOW THE U.S. AVERAGE.

OUR FLOURISHING ECONOMY HAS BEEN NO ACCIDENT. IT HAS
BEEN THE RESULT OF SEVERAL FUNDAMENTAL VIRTUES POSSESSED BY
THE STATE.

MINNESOTA HAS LONG MADE EDUCATION ONE OF ITS FOREMOST PRIORITIES. OUR UNIVERSITY OF MINNESOTA WAS FOUNDED SEVEN YEARS BEFORE MINNESOTA BECAME A STATE IN 1858. TODAY THE UNIVERSITY HAS ONE OF THE NATION'S MOST HIGHLY RATED ENGINEERING SCHOOLS. ITS LAW AND MEDICAL SCHOOLS ARE ALSO WELL KNOWN AND HIGHLY RESPECTED.

THE STATE HAS 173 OTHER INSTITUTIONS OF HIGHER LEARNING. AND AN IMPRESSIVE 63% OF THE STATE'S HIGH SCHOOL GRADUATES GO ON TO ATTEND THEM. ONLY ONE OTHER STATE SPENDS MORE
ON EDUCATION FOR EACH ONE OF ITS CITIZENS THAN MINNESOTA
DOES. NINETY PER CENT OF ITS PUPILS GRADUATE FROM HIGH
SCHOOL, MORE THAN IN ANY OTHER STATE IN THE NATION.

ITS EDUCATIONAL SYSTEM IS BUT ONE PART OF A WELLDEVELOPED INFRASTRUCTURE THAT THE STATE OFFERS YOU. IT HAS
SUPERB RAIL AND HIGHWAY CONNECTIONS. IT IS HOME TO NORTHWEST
AIRLINES, WHICH PROVIDES MORE FLIGHTS TO THE FAR EAST THAN
ANY OTHER CARRIER.

PUBLIC FUNDS ARE SPENT WISELY. THEY HAVE BEEN SPENT ON RELIABLE GOVERNMENT SERVICES. THEY HAVE BEEN USED TO ASSUAGE SOCIAL PROBLEMS TO GIVE ITS CITIZENS A HAPPIER AND HEALTHIER LIFE. PERHAPS THAT IS ONE REASON WHY PRODUCTIVITY IN MINNESOTA IS 10% ABOVE THE NATIONAL AVERAGE.

BUT SOME OF MINNESOTA'S FOREMOST QUALITIES CAN'T BEEN SEEN OR TOUCHED.

THE STATE HAS CARVED OUT A NATIONAL REPUTATION FOR INVENTION, INNOVATION AND ENTREPRENEURIALISM. WE'VE AMASSED

MORE PATENTS PER RESIDENT THAN ALL BUT FIVE OTHER STATES.

MINNESOTA INDUSTRY DEVOTES 2.5% OF ITS GROSS STATE PRODUCT

TO RESARCH AND DEVELOPMENT, ONE OF THE NATION'S HIGHEST

LEVELS. THERE ARE MORE THAN 1,800 HIGH TECHNOLOGY FIRMS IN
MINNESOTA.

IN FACT, FOR ITS SIZE, MINNESOTA HAS MORE HIGH-GROWTH STARTUP COMPANIES THAN ANY OTHER STATE.

THE STATE HAS GIVEN RISE TO A NUMBER OF INTERNATIONALLY KNOWN ENTREPRENEURS. THEY HAVE SPAWNED A STEADY OF STREAM OF IDEAS, PRODUCTS AND BUSINESSES. MANY HAVE FOUND A PLACE IN WORLD MARKETS.

EVEN ESTABLISHED CORPORATIONS ENCOURAGE INNOVATION. 3M EMPLOYEES ARE PERMITTED TO SPEND 15 PER CENT OF THEIR COMPANY TIME ON PROJECTS OF THEIR OWN CHOOSING. THAT IS HOW THE COMPANY DEVELOPED POST-IT NOTES, A HIGHLY POPULAR PRODUCT USED IN OFFICES THROUGHOUT THE WORLD.

MINNESOTA COUNTS COMMITTED CIVIC LEADERSHIP AMONG ITS VIRTUES TOO. BUSINESS EXECUTIVES TAKE AN ACTIVE ROLE IN SHAPING MINNESOTA'S FUTURE. THEIR APPROACH HAS BEEN ONE OF COOPERATION, NOT CONFRONTATION.

AN ORGANIZATION CALLED MINNESOTA WELLSPRING, FOR EXAM-PLE, WAS FORMED BY BUSINESS AND LABOR TO JOINTLY ADDRESS CONCERNS ABOUT THE STATE'S ECONOMIC FUTURE.

MINNESOTA COMPANIES HAVE BACKED THEIR INVOLVEMENT WITH FINANCIAL COMMITMENT. THEY HAVE FORMED A GROUP NAMED THE FIVE PER CENT CLUB. MEMBER COMPANIES CONTRIBUTE FIVE PER CENT OF THEIR PRE-TAX PROFITS FOR COMMUNITY OR CHARITABLE PURPOSES.

THANKS TO SUCH EFFORTS, MINNESOTANS ARE PROUD OF THE HIGH QUALITY OF LIFE THEY HAVE. THEY ENJOY RECREATIONAL AND CULTURAL AMENITIES FAR BEYOND THOSE IN STATES OF SIMILAR SIZE. CORPORATE RECRUITERS ARE FOND OF SAYING THAT OUR WINTERS SOMETIMES MAKE PEOPLE RELUCTANT TO MOVE INTO MINNESOTA. BUT ONCE PEOPLE GET TO MINNESOTA IT'S VIRTUALLY IMPOSSIBLE TO GET THEM TO LEAVE AGAIN.

MINNESOTANS FEEL AN AFFINITY FOR CITIZENS OF YOUR NATION. WE SHARE MANY OF THE SAME BASIC VALUES -- HARD WORK,
THE POLITE REGARD FOR OTHERS, A DEDICATION TO QUALITY, AND A
WILLINGNESS TO INVEST FOR THE LONG-TERM.

THE SPEAKERS WHO FOLLOW ME WILL ELABORATE ON MANY OF
THE GOOD THINGS I HAVE TOUCHED UPON. WE UNDERSTAND THE NEEDS
OF PEOPLE LIKE YOU WHO ARE RESPONSIBLE FOR MAKING DIFFICULT
INTERNATIONAL BUSINESS DECISIONS. WE HAVE THE INFORMATION TO
HELP YOU MAKE SUCH IMPORTANT LONG-TERM AND OFTEN EXPENSIVE
DECISIONS. WE HOPE WE HAVE SUCCEEDED IN BEGINNING TO SHOW
YOU THAT MINNESOTA IS A VERY SPECIAL PLACE -- WITH MANY OPPORTUNITIES FOR PROSPERTY.
