- BECAUSE THE AMERICANS COME AND GO AT THIS EMBASSY ON THEIR TWO-, THREE-AND FOUR-YEAR TOURS OF DUTY, IT IS OUR FOREIGN SERVICE NATIONAL EMPLOYEES WHO PROVIDE THE ESSENTIAL <u>CONTINUITY</u> THE INSTITUTIONAL MEMORY THAT ENABLES THIS EMBASSY TO OPERATE EFFECTIVELY YEAR IN AND YEAR OUT.
- TO DO MY JOB WELL, I KNOW THAT I DEPEND ON EACH OF YOU AND I AM GRATEFUL THAT YOU ARE HERE.
- THIS IS A BIG EMBASSY. SOMETIMES, I AM SURE, IT CAN SEEM LIKE IT IS TOO BIG —
 TOO BUREAUCRATIC AND TOO IMPERSONAL. I WANT TO AVOID THAT AS MUCH AS POSSIBLE. I

 IMPORTANT THING IS THAT YOU ENJOY THE WORK THAT YOU ARE DOING. I WANT YOU TO FEEL
 THAT YOU ARE NEEDED. THAT YOU ARE BEING PRODUCTIVE, THAT YOUR EFFORTS ARE VALUED.
 - IN FACT, MY WISH IS THAT EVERYONE CAN ENJOY THEIR JOB AS MUCH AS I DO.
- I HOPE WE CAN ALWAYS <u>WORK TOGETHER</u> AS A TEAM BOTH JAPANESE AND AMERICANS. I HAVE BEEN IMPRESSED BY THE STRONG FEELING OF COLLEGIALITY THAT EXISTS HERE. WE ARE ALL HERE FOR THE SAME PURPOSE TO HELP ADVANCE THIS VERY SPECIAL DIPLOMATIC PARTNERSHIP BETWEEN JAPAN AND THE UNITED STATES.

- MY HOPE IS THAT OUR EMBASSY CAN EXEMPLIFY THE VERY BEST ABOUT THIS RELATIONSHIP.
- THE TRUTH IS, AFTER ALL, THAT I AM NOT THE ONLY AMBASSADOR AT THIS EMBASSY.

 EVERY PERSON WHO WORKS HERE WHETHER JAPANESE OR AMERICAN IS ALSO AN

 "AMBASSADOR" IN HIS OR HER OWN RIGHT.
