(TO GIVE ONE EXAMPLE, U.S. FIRMS HOLD OVER 80% OF THE PACKAGE SOFTWARE MARKET IN JAPAN.) WE ARE THEREFORE PROUD TO DISPLAY OUR PRODUCTS TO OUR TRANSPACIFIC NEIGHBORS IN JAPAN.

GROWTH IN THE ELECTRONICS SECTOR IS DUE IN LARGE PART TO EFFORTS
TOWARDS DEREGULATION. ELECTRONICS IS ONE OF MANY SECTORS IN WHICH
REGULATION CAN ONLY STIFLE GROWTH, AND IN WHICH COMPETITION IS GOOD FOR ALL
OF US. MANY STRONG AMERICAN COMPANIES EVEN COMPETE FOR CONSUMER
ATTENTION WITHIN THIS SHOW ITSELF. SUCH A HEALTHY INTERCHANGE SPARKS
CREATIVITY AND INNOVATION, WHICH GENERATES AN ARRAY OF NEW AND MORE
AFFORDABLE PRODUCTS FOR CONSUMERS IN BOTH NATIONS.

THE "GLOBAL INFORMATION INFRASTRUCTURE" WHICH OUR GOVERNMENTS ARE PURSUING IS ANOTHER LIFE-CHANGING CONCEPT, AND AT THIS SHOW YOU WILL SEE THE PHYSICAL COMPONENTS -- THE HARDWARE AND SOFTWARE TOOLS -- NECESSARY TO REALIZE THIS CONCEPT. WITH THESE TOOLS, WE WILL CREATE A GLOBAL DIGITAL LIBRARY SO THAT OUR CHILDREN AND THEIR COUNTERPARTS AROUND THE GLOBE WILL HAVE QUICKER AND MORE MEANINGFUL ACCESS TO THE WORLD'S WEALTH OF INFORMATION.
