I would be glad if we could sell to other nations as well but Great Britain, France and Italy want 400,000,000 bushels while all the other countries want only from 100,000,000 to 150,000,000 bushels. I do not want to see our people forced to carry over a large surplus of grain which would certainly reduce prices not only for this year but for two or three years to come.
