recd & contents carefully noted. We
are well aware that the market for Salt
is very much demoralized just now &
probably will remain so until a little
later in the season. Manufacturers at Niagara
or anywhere else are making no money
on manufacturing it necessarily follows that
Dealers will have also to work on small margins
or let the trade alone. We are not disposed to
make the price less than 1¹⁵ in board at
Buffalo, but would let you know what you
want at that until further notice. We are
taking as full share of the trade at Chicago
& Milwaukee sold nearly 60000 Bbls June
at their prices in July at an average of
over 1²⁵ which gives us a net of at least
1²⁰ in Buffalo.
