I saw Capt
Mr Ray of Prop Mammoth, a brother to
the Captain of Sparta. The Mammoth, Sparta
and Consort were in a terrible gale together.
Sparta and Consort were at White Fish Point
Friday Oct 29th, Gale struck them four o'clock
Saturday morning, parted company 7 o'clock
in the evening, Sparta made Marquette
Sunday morning. He said there; a vessel
reported wrecked and a tug sent to see, but
could find no trace. Captain of Mammoth
telegraphed from Portage to Marquette
and the following is the reply, Scumatra
all right, red cut gale at two head river,
slightly damaged, towed to Sault, Sparta
cleared for Sault Nov 3rd at 8 A.M.,
Armstrong's coal all gone forward
