Dear Sirs Your favor of the 8th at hand. I only wish that the oats were on the other side of the river. Ed made arrangements with Mr Charles for the boats to come but whenever a boat came there was an order from Mr Wilder for her to proceed below immediately.

Consequently we have be dissapointed very much. The St Fontenelle, East Saturday, was stuck this side of Standing Rock and if she did not get away that day ~~is~~ will have to winter there as the river is closing and will be frozen solid tomorrow. It is very cold to night and if it continues Texas will be able to cross in

a few days. As soon as the last
boat went down I ~~integrated~~
you, as I did not want to get
in any scrape and I have not
used the draft yet, but am
waiting for an answer from you
which I expect soon. From
present appearances, it will
not be long before we can put
teams to hauling and when we
can, will put 20 or 30 teams
at it. I received a telegram
from Ed dated in St Paul, today
so I suppose that I shall hear
from some one tomorrow—
This is a lonesome country &
I will be glad when I get out
of it—
