My dear Sir:-

I beg to enclose herewith letter of Col. James Baker, dated Victoria, March 5th '92, which arrived here yesterday. I forward it to you thinking you might like to see it without delay.

Both the children are well and everything seems to be going smoothly at your house. Archie Maclean goes to Milwaukee tonight and if he can't find what he wants at that place, will go as far as Chicago.

I enclose statement of approximate earnings of The Mason City and Fort Dodge Railroad for February, showing an increase of 39% over the corresponding month of '91. Mahoney reports that there is a large quantity of grain still remaining in the farmers' hands and in warehouses along our tracks, and we therefore look for the earnings to show a favorable increase during the coming four months of the fiscal year. From July 1st to February 29th the earnings amounted to \$98,000, and I feel pretty confident the earnings for the current fiscal year will reach \$140,000.00 - equivalent to 25% increase



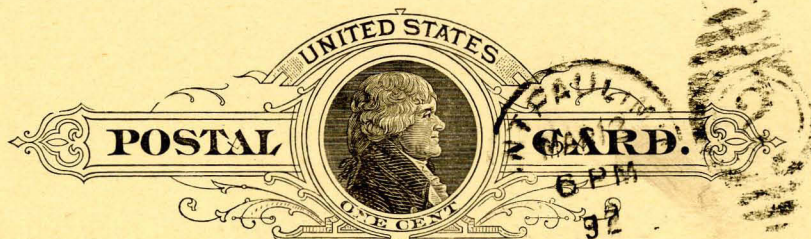
