suggestions. Next week we will have the
wheat pretty well out of the elevator
& would suggest that before the 25th of April
you get a timber under the Centre & blocked

again, & the large core wheel over the water wheel

TO THE MEMBERS OF THE CHICAGO CLUB:

In connection with the purchase of the Art Institute property for a new club house, it seemed necessary for the Club to borrow \$500,000, and two five per cent loans of equal amounts, to be respectively secured by a first and a second mortgage, were provisionally decided upon. Subscriptions for the proposed five per cent second mortgage bonds were thereupon invited from members of the Club, and in a short time, without much solicitation, the entire amount was subscribed by less than one-half of the members. It is now contemplated to reduce the amount of the first mortgage loan to \$150,000, and to increase the second mortgage loan to \$350,000. The reason for this is mainly one of convenience. The Art Institute property is already covered by a five per cent mortgage for \$150,000, having now about nine years to run, and if the contemplated change is carried out, this existing mortgage on the property can be left as it is, the Club merely assuming it.

This letter is intended to be sent only to members who have not heretofore subscribed for any of the proposed second mortgage bonds, in order to give such members the opportunity of subscribing to the increased issue now contemplated.

Such subscriptions are hereby invited, and they may be sent to the Secretary and Treasurer of the Club, Mr. ALLISON V. ARMOUR, addressed to him at the club house in Chicago. For convenience, a form of subscription and an addressed envelope are enclosed. Payment of the subscriptions will necessarily be called for at an early day. Subscriptions will be entered in the order of their receipt, and

if the total amount subscribed exceeds the amount needed, the bonds will either be allotted proportionately, or the surplus subscriptions will be canceled and returned.

Attention is called to the fact that the present annual dues of \$80.00 for resident members and \$40.00 for non-resident members, represent exactly the annual interest upon \$1,600.00 and \$800.00, respectively, of the proposed second mortgage bonds.
