The Mills & other Manufacturing establishments using power from
 same are. The Otter Tail Mill - of capacity of 200 to
 225 Bbls. in 24 hours. The Cable Mill about the
 same capacity - The Printing Office - The Bell Feed Mill
 O. F. Collen Lash & Saw Blind & planing mill - 1 Tanning
 Mill Manufacturing and a Carding Mill

- Since the R.R. Roller Mill dam has been put on -
 all of the above have been built & commenced using
 water since excepting the Cable Mill & O. F. Collen -
 which were built using water before the R.R. dam
 was built, to enable them to make the increased power
 they have increased the number of wheels -

Originally they had only two wheels at the time of the building of
 the R.R. Mills and now they have 4 or 5 wheels - which are all in
 use during the day time which uses ~~at~~ more than the natural
 flow and draw on their head - during the day - and when they shut

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down at night it hold back the water which requires
me to shut down - ~~at times~~ about 1 hour each evening and
limits the power during the night to about $\frac{1}{2}$ the
capacity of the water power. Every time I shut
down it is done at an expense of from 1⁰⁰ to 2⁰⁰ for
loss of material - in addition to which is the loss of
time of mill hands which in all matters the loss
from 7⁰⁰ to 7⁵⁰. This has been continuous since last
August. The Cable Mill are now running night
and day - but do not use as much water on account
of having a higher head.
