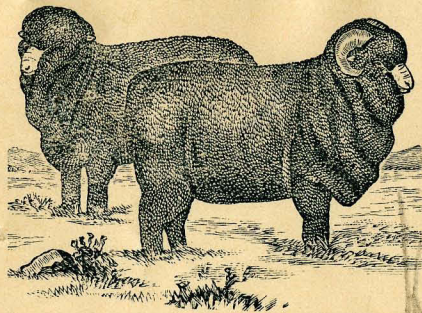

We have been informed that the following notes, which we have given to the Commercial Bank, have been transferred to you & are now in your possession:

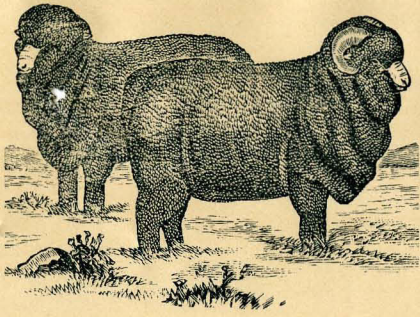

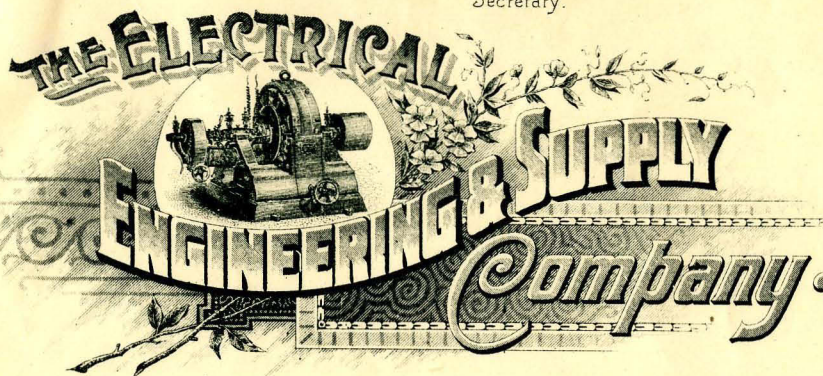
