It is not necessary for the Lease to
specify that rent should cease when
you were making repairs that the
Lease specifies should be made.
The Lease contemplates the rental of a
Mill; any cause that makes it not a
Mill fire &c the rental necessarily
ceases; unless specially provided that it should
not; In consequence of the recognizing of wheel
we lost \$25⁰⁰ per day, this amt could have been
charged. but we only charged for actual time as
per yearly lease. If you will make enquiry
of some mill men who rent Mill you will
find our position correct. will hold the check
until we hear from you again.

Dear Sir. Owing to the enormous rain
fall yesterday & especially last evening
we got the greatest rise in the River
here ever known. I got a number of men
& secured the Dam & watched every point
& we arrested the dam going out. The other
Mills or rather owners of the power had large
crews working one dam above got washed
badly & this P.M. I was up & they had teams
& about fifteen men working like beavers to
get the washout stopped. It was thought
early this A.M. that the two upper dams would
go out - we opened up everything & kept
as safe as possible. it looked serious for
all the dams at one time - but thank the danger is
over. although there is a large flow still, we
will keep men to watch all night.
