Enclosed please find letter which will partially explain itself. Mr. Burgess is my trainer and is a most excellent man with horses in breaking handling and driving, but you will notice has not much education. He did not know to whom I had sold the mares Senora and Senorita and the colt Ingot Copper and wrote this letter to me of his own volition. I merely send it to you so that it will be thoroughly understood just what the horses are so that there will not be any mistake made in handling them. The mares are perfectly kind and gentle and will only need careful usage and care in getting them used to strange sights and things in the city. Instruct the man who is to have them in charge not to whip them or speak cross to or swear at them and to always be very gentle and firm in handling them, and when they see anything that they are afraid of, stop them, let them look at it and then let them work up to it gradually and encourage them by talking to them, and they will soon learn to have confidence in him and be afraid of nothing after they are once accustomed to it. I am thus particular in telling you of them for I want nothing to happen to them as I consider them the finest match^{ed} team that I ever saw put together, barring speed, and there is no reason why they should not have this if they are handled for it. They will at least make a great pair of roadsters and be a joy and pride to their owner. I had intended them for myself and no one else but Mr. Hill could ever have gotten them. They will be valuable in the stud, should they get injured or when their driving days are over, which adds to their worth.

The colt Ingot Copper is the best one that I raised that year and should make a very fine, handsome and choice stallion if nothing happens him, for he is bred right and shaped right to be a good one.
