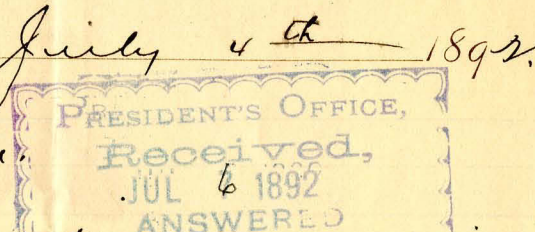
He is well qualified for the office and would be able to give good satisfaction regardless of politics.

I write believing that you will agree with me that in State officers more regard should be had for the personal fitness of the man than his political creed.

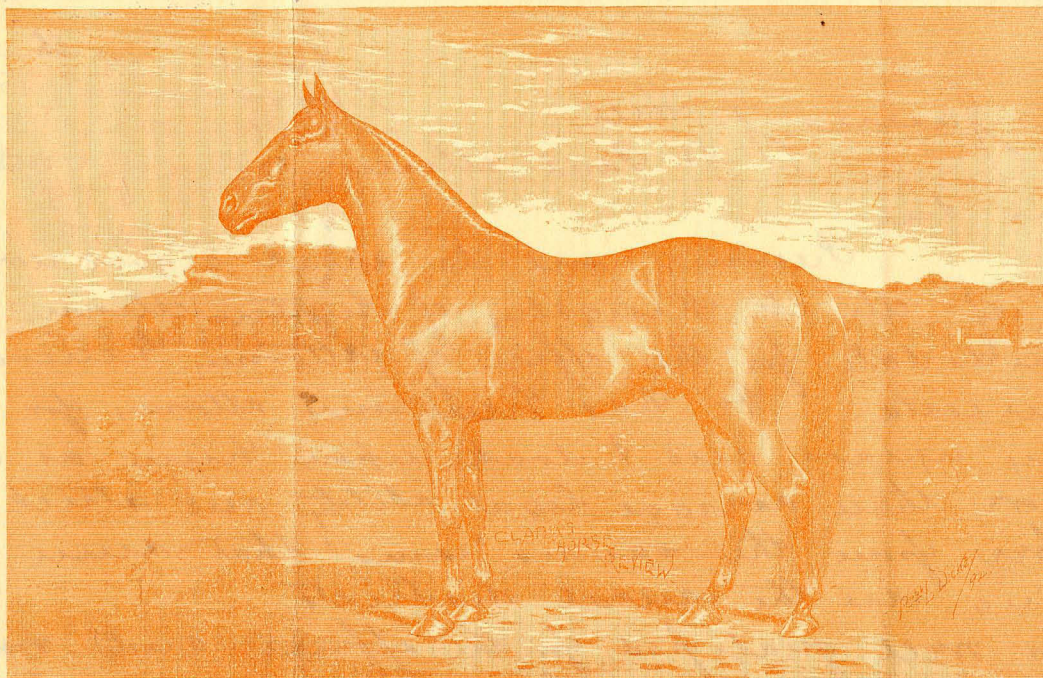

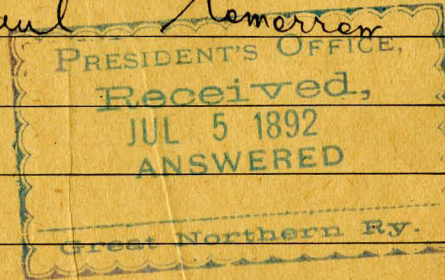
