

I did not receive to-day, as I expected, the complete list writes of the Van Prat pictures. My brother Charles tells me that he gave you a list of these pictures last year and that he will procure one for me; I expect, therefore, I will receive it sometime this week.

I have just received a letter from my father in which he speaks to me about that Collection. He says there are five pictures which are alone worth an enormous price: the Millet, "La Bergère," is worth 300,000francs; the large Rousseau, 250,000francs; the Troyon, 200,000; the Decamps, Christ, 150,000; and the Dupré, "La Vanne," 150,000- My father says these prices are very moderate, and the pictures will bring more at public auction. These are the prices at which he valued them six or seven years ago. The Rousseau is the finest example of the master that my father knows, and there is no telling what it would bring in a public sale; it would very probably bring a fancy price.

Besides that there are other fine Millets, Rousseaus, Decamps, Corots, Delacroix, etc. There are five or six Meissoniers of the first quality, and although my father does not much care for Meissonier's works, he says these can go in a first-class gallery as they are of an entirely exceptional quality.

My father has such confidence in that Collection that if he
