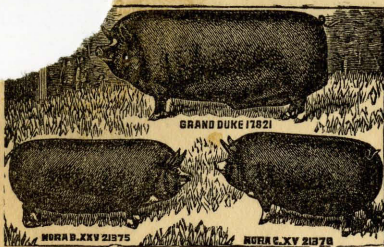


Dear Sir:-

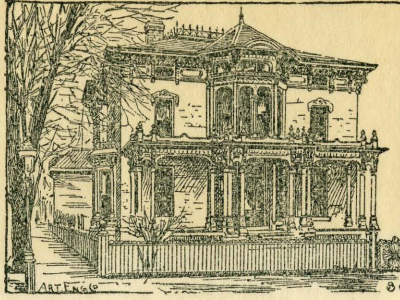
