



My Dear Sir:-

Replying to your note of the 13th inst., I beg to say that Great Falls stock is, in my judgment, worth much more than it is selling for. The Comphy owns a large tract of land, which, at the present price of acres on the outside of this tract, would amount to more than the par value of the stock. The reserved lots in the town are valued by the local officers at over two million dollars, and this is on a basis of low prices, or substantially what might be called forced sales. The stock has sold from 75 to 90, according to the anxiety of the parties wishing to sell or buy. There has been no boom there, and I trust there will not be any, although everything locally looks well for Great Falls. If you can buy the stock at 75, I should think you would make a good investment.
