Dear Sir:

The undersigned who is commissioned by the Am. Bap. Home Mission Society of New York City, has been earnestly at work for three years, for the uplifting, morally, spiritually & intellectually - of the two thousands or more Scandinavians, residing beyond the ^{shops &} tracks of the "Great Northern" in this city.

Many homes and hundreds of individuals are to day living witnessess of the ennobling & elevating influences of our work in that part of our City. The Church in which I have ^{been} gathering the people could last winter no longer contain those who would come, and so I decided to build in order to accomodate the people; and as a result a plain but great structure is raised which will hold 500 Persons.

The poor people out here were not able to do this alone, but I appealed to many people and prominent men who have given largely. But yet I need about \$1100⁰⁰ more, in order to complet, and knowing that you have, before this, shown a warm heart in similar enterprises, and that you will ever live in the kind thought of the people, I plead in the name of many shopmen and poor people for \$500 from you.
