We had a meeting
yesterday afternoon of the
representatives of the dif-
ferent public bodies of the
city to confer about the pro-
posed convention of the
advocates of the imme-
diate and unconditional
repeal of the silver pur-
chase clause of the Sher-
man bill.

There has developed
some opposition to its being
held for three principal

reasons (1) lack of time
to get proper representa-
tion (2) fear that Dr.
Paul may be committed
by ~~unwise~~ ^{extreme} more to a too
radical policy against
silver & so (3) require us
as a distributing and
commercial center
with Montana and
the other silver States
to the Northwest of ab.

After a pretty full dis-
cussion in which the
sentiment seemed much
divided, the meeting ad-
journed until 4 o'clock
to-day - Tuesday - at the
