Dear Sir:

I will ship some horses from Lexington, Ky. to Dillon, Montana, and gave orders to have them shipped via the Great Northern.

When Mr. Hill was here last I sold him some mares and have one mare in this lot coming from Lexington that I sent east about a year ago and bred to Allie Wilkes 2:15, son of Red Wilkes, at a stud fee of \$200.00, which I wish to leave for him and have instructed the man in charge to call on you and deliver her to you at the stock yards as he will unload and rest there. Her pedigree is as follows: Isabella by Com. Belmont, 4340,; dam Confidence by Pilot Mambrino 515; second dam Highland Maid s.t.b. by Mambrunello 2:21; third dam s.t.b. by Highlander. Bay mare; star; strip in face; near hind ankle white; foaled 1885. She is No. 32, page 45 in my catalogue, a dozen copies of which I sent to Mr. Hill sometime since. I bought this mare of Mr. W.H. Raymond when a filly, and if my recollection serves me right, I paid him \$500.00 for her. She foaled a very fine horse colt by Allen 2:30 this spring which I let Mr. R.W. Goodrich, Poultney, Vt. have. Should she prove in foal to Allie Wilkes, 2:15, her foal will be worth a great deal of money as I consider him the best son of Red Wilkes. His dam was Alex by Allie West, 745, son of Almont, second dam Sue by American Clay 34, &c.

Red Wilkes has put 20 in the 2:30 list this year and up to 1892 had 49 trotters and 10 pacers in the list and 9 sons that had sired 9 trotters and 2 pacers and 6 daughters that had produced 6 trotters and 1 pacer. Red Wilkes is without doubt the best son of George Wilkes. I bred a mare to him this season at a stud fee of \$1000 and bred seven mares to Allie Wilkes at \$200.00 each.

I am shipping in an Arms Palace car and will return same via the Great Northern with some more horses for Mr. Hill.

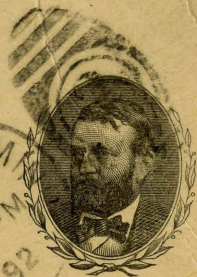
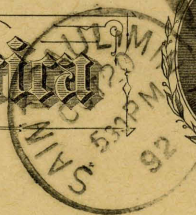
