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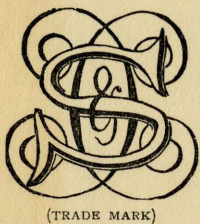

I beg to

acknowledge receipt of your favor of 19th.
In reply to your finding fault with
me for not apprising you earlier of
my movement in regard to furniture
I would like to say this. My original
idea was to let Mr Bruno use the
furniture on a month lease from
month to month till about May, 1892.
& then dispose of the same providing
this could have been done without
expense. In the last part of October
Mr Bruno told me he could not
any more run the hotel for which I
do not blame him at all. My
attorney & myself then tried to arrange
with him for taking care of the furniture

from Nov 8th till 1st of April 92. but
we could not come to any agreement.
Mr Bruns wanted \$1000. & used
the furniture for keeping & looking after
the same. I did not feel warranted
to expend \$500⁰⁰ in this way neither
would the Court allow it & my attorney
thought it the best to sell said furniture
at public auction. In the meantime
I have to watch the furniture night & day
& pay Mr Bruns for storage \$10⁰⁰ per
day he wanted \$15⁰⁰ originally but agreed
to the last figure. You was annoyed by
me at once in my letter of the sale
knowing it about the same time as I knew
it myself. At the same time Mr Cantigny
looked over the furniture & wanted to buy
same as you know. I have postponed
the sale indefinitely but you will see
that an expense of over 15 dollars a day

Cannot be paid very long by me &
something must be done quickly.
Any suggestion which you might make
will be very kindly received by me
and appreciated. You will see
that the sooner the expense is stopped the
better for the Creditors & consequently the
better for Mr. Hill? Let me also remind
you that my attorney wrote you this
summer, twice in regard to the land
embraced in Mr. Hill's claim but that
up to date the receipt of same has
never been acknowledged in any way.
I will see Mr. Canting to morrow & tell him
the contents of your letter. You might
prevail on Mr. Bruns poss. bly to reduce
the storage items in so doing giving
plenty of time. please let me hear from
you soon & oblige
