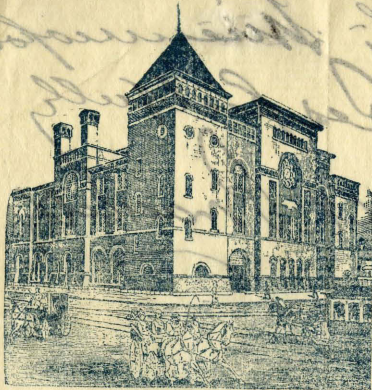

The Swedish Ev. Mission Covenant of America have decided to build a school including four departments, 1st a Practical (including business College) 2nd. Academy, 3rd. College, 4th. Theological seminary.

This school has been in working order for over a year in Minneapolis with great success. The students which include both sexes and ages number now nearly one hundred and we expect one hundred and fifty in Jan.

The location of the school is now at "The Swedish Tabernacle" which is entirely too small for all those who are coming.

For that reason we wish to try and get a school building that will meet the needs. But as you know, most of the Swedes are poor, especially those who have any interest for such an institution.

We therefore ask you, Mr Hill, if you feel like doing anything, to help this Swedish institution along. There is no doubt in few years have at least Three Hundred students and it will be a great help for the masses of young Scandinavians of the north west.

They worked very hard to get it to Chicago, even so to Omaha, from which places they offer sites and money to build with.

Now we in Mnpls. and St. Paul work to put it here.

It is in the hands of two Committees to receive offers and decide where it should be located.

We have promises of sites for the school from three parties in Mnpls, named ten acres from each. What we now need is from \$25,000 to \$50,000 to build with.

Knowing many instances of your generosity in helping along such institutions, we hereby ask you to take this matter in consideration, if you find it worth to do anything for it.
