

Sherman Morgan was the best son of Justin Morgan, the founder of the Morgan family. Vermont Black Hawk, the best son of Sherman Morgan, was remarkable for his beauty and for his ability to impart his trotting instincts and tireless endurance. Ethan Allen was the best son of Vermont Black Hawk, and his equal in all respects; was famous for his performances with a running mate, especially when he beat Dexter in 2:15, 2:16 and 2:19, and as the sire of Billy D, 2:141/2; Frank, 2:081/2; H. B. Winship, 2:06, with running mates; and as the sire of Dan Lambert, his best son, more than one hundred of whose descendants are in the 2:30 list.

Star Ethan and Allen have both shown better than 2:30 in private trial.

Priam, the sire of Monarch, was the wonder of his day, and when advanced in years was imported into this country at a cost exceeding \$30,000. Monarch in his day was the fastest and stoutest racer in America. He never lost a race nor a heat. Col. Hampton refused \$20,000 for him at a race in South Carolina, where he ran the fourth mile in 1:48, with 111 lbs. up. If there is anything in blood, Stanley ought, with such a combination, to leave many valuable descendants. He has never been trained to trot, but is level-headed, pure-gaited, has an open, slashing style, great power and endurance, is remarkably playful, quiet and intelligent, and a stylish driver.
