you would indicate.

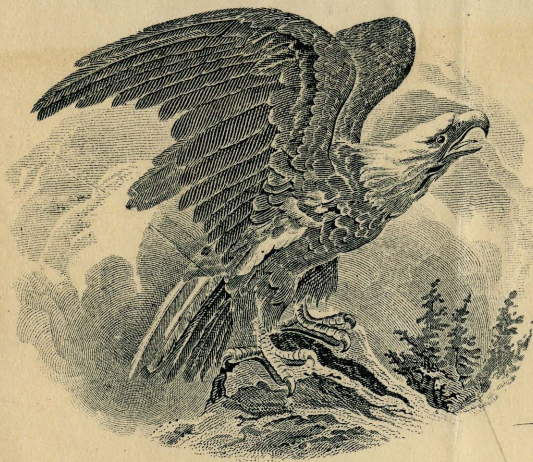
The painting has a fine gold
