one 10 " " " artesian well	700.

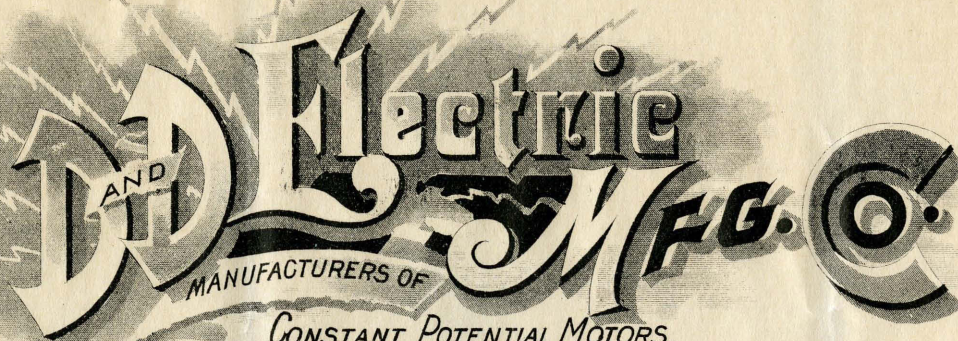
and according to our contract we still have to furnish:-

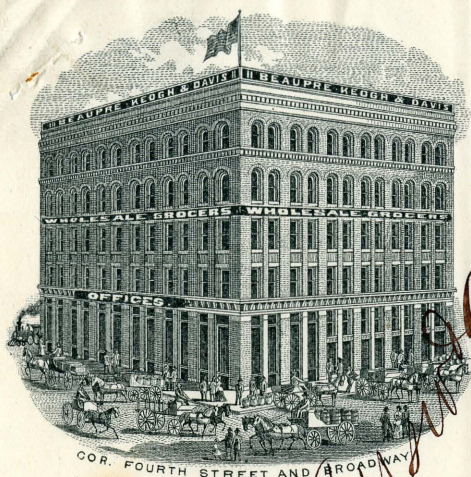
