Dear Sir: Since rendering Mr Hill's account on
14th inst. I have paid to Louis W. Hill \$250. and
today have received from the Central Ohio Natural Gas
& Fuel Co a check to Mr Hill's order for \$514. dated
Feb'y 15/93, which is apparently a dividend of 1% on
his stock.

I wired you on the 16th inst. asking you to see
Warren and wire if settlement of the loan matter
stated in his letter of 3rd to me was satisfactory
to you. Not hearing from you I have settled the
matter in accordance with Warren's letter, so far as
the \$600,000. is concerned, leaving the money thus
advanced by Mr Hill as interest on outside loans to
be adjusted. Please see Mr Hill and then advise
me whether this interest is to be adjusted by me here
or whether you will make a bill on the Company
for it in St Paul.
