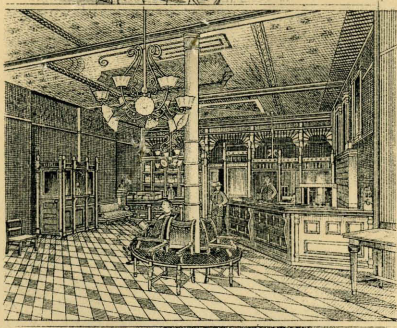

I told him I thought his brother did not realize the importance of bringing his Montana County men in line, in the early part of the session, and that we believed at the time, ~~that~~ he was able to aid us.

On my arrival here, I found your several letters.

I was very much surprised at the one containing the message from Mr. Hill. The two members of the legislature from our end of Missoula County had been in Helena several days before I reached there, and had got themselves tied up in a caucus. I went with Senator Gibson, and did everything in my power to get them to break away; and the only promise we could get from them was that, when the caucus was dissolved, which looked as if it would be in a few days, they would follow Senator Gibson's instructions and work with him.

I would as soon think of cutting off my right hand as to prove disloyal to Mr. Hill's wishes while I am connected with him in business, and do not think I should be censured for something I could not accomplish when I used every effort to do so. I still believe Senator Gibson has the best show of any democrat to be elected to the senate.

I leave for Helena to-night via Spokane, as the road is blocked between here and Havre. Will go from Helena to
