The apartments comprise gentlemen's reading, writing, reception and smoking rooms; ladies' drawing room, reception and toilet rooms; postoffice department, bureau of information and the offices of the Club.

The essential purposes of the organization are as follows, viz:

To provide and maintain a select resort, furnished with the accommodations and comforts of a high class club, whose apartments are the headquarters of members and the meeting place of their friends, especial provision being made for the comfort of ladies.

To provide special facilities for the prompt delivery of letters addressed in care of the Club. Such letters will be received and delivered to members when here, or re-mailed to any desired address.

To assist in securing, for all who may desire it, suitable and acceptable accommodations, in hotels or private houses during their stay in Chicago.

In selecting the Auditorium Building for the location of the Club, due consideration was given to the fact that it is in immediate proximity to the four great transportation systems between the city and the Exposition: The Illinois Central Railroad, the Elevated Railway, the direct cable cars and the lake boat lines. It is also in the immediate vicinity of the finest hotels and the central shopping district of the city; and the building itself possesses, in a greater degree than any other, the high character and associations desirable for such an institution as this Club.

While the number of prominent British and Canadian gentlemen enrolled will be so large as to render necessary a limit to the American members that can be received, it is yet very desirable to afford representative American gentlemen an opportunity to meet the distinguished visitors from abroad. To provide for this and maintain the standard of membership, a committee has been appointed to pass upon applicants for admission. Invitations will be forwarded to such as are accepted.
