

7. The Company acquires the entire fishing rights in the splendid salmon and trout stream, held under license from Government known as the Grand Pabos. This lease expires on the thirty-first day of December, A.D., 1898, but will be renewable.

8. As opportunity offers, it is the intention of the Club to acquire fishing and shooting rights until the Club shall afford to its members the greatest facilities for these noble sports; it is also proposed to acquire a suitable steam or sail yacht and several smaller boats for the purposes of the Club, also horses, carriages, etc.

9. The purchase price for the "Inch Arran" property, inclusive of the complete and valuable furniture, and fittings of the Hotel, and the fishing rights held or controlled by the Vendors is \$15,000 cash, and \$10,000 in fully paid up stock of the Company. Thus, there will be left \$25,000 with which to acquire further fishing rights, shooting rights, and the yachts, boats, horses, carriages or what may be needed for improvements of the Company's property, and the adding to its attractions as a summer resort, as well as a good working capital.

10. One share or more of the capital stock, signed by the President and Treasurer, shall be issued to each member, who shall have been duly elected, and who shall have paid for his stock as an original member, or who shall produce and deliver up a certificate of stock in due form with a consent of the General Committee to the transfer thereof, and shall pay the annual fee, if any, but no share which has been purchased shall be transferred until all amounts due thereon, and all indebtedness and liability of any nature from the owner thereof, has been paid and satisfied and the consent of the Committee obtained to the transfer.

11. Such certificates shall be kept in a book, and regularly numbered and registered.

12. The holders of five shares shall alone be entitled to the fishing and shooting rights on the property of the Club or connected with its licenses or leases, and these shares shall be called full shares.

A full share shall entitle a member to all the privileges accorded to the holders of a single share, and, for each additional full share, he will have the right to invite one guest during the fishing season. Such guest shall be entitled to the same fishing rights enjoyed by members, but must accompany the member inviting him, and his stay for fishing privileges shall be limited to the member's stay, except when the member shall be called away within two weeks after his arrival, in which case the guest may remain until the two weeks have elapsed.

13. The holder of a single share in the Company of \$100.00, shall be entitled to all the privileges of the Club save those mentioned as peculiar to the holders of full shares, which apply only to the fishing and shooting privileges on the Company's preserves.

14. By the act under the provisions of which the Company is incorporated, no shareholder is liable beyond the amount of his share.

15. It will be one of the great objects of the Club to afford to its members, their families and friends, all the advantages of a private club, whilst providing them at the same time with a sea-side resort more interesting and health-giving than the famous "Long Branch," and were the best yachting, fishing and shooting in any part of the world is to be found combined.
