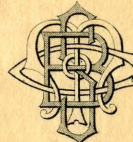

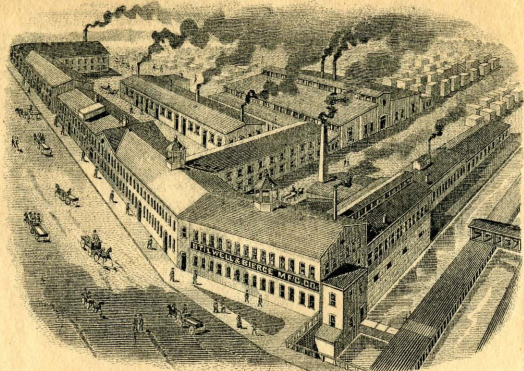


Dear Sir:-
