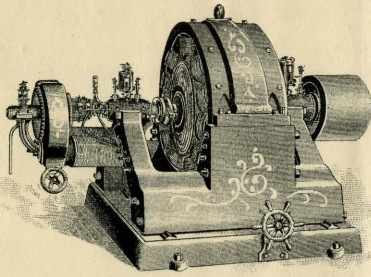

Dear Sir;-

Regarding the point made to me yesterday by your book-keeper; that we had charged for Mr. Chapman's time at the rate of \$2.85 and \$3.50 per day at different times, would say, that when Mr. Chapman first came into our employ we paid him \$75.00 per month, which, figuring twenty six working days to the month, makes almost exactly \$2.85 per day. Afterwards his pay was raised, and then ^{later} we employed him for some time at \$3.50 per day, only paying him for those days during which he worked. We feel satisfied that in each case we charged you the exact cost to us of Mr. Chapman's time for the particular job upon which he was working and the apparent discrimination in the charges is explained as above. You will find upon examination that 20% has been added in each case to the amount we paid Mr. Chapman.

We trust this explanation will be satisfactory, and will enable you to close this part of the contract.

I beg to advise you that I have to-day paid to the American Exchange National Bank for account of the Merchants National Bank of St. Paul, for use of W. R. Merriam, Trustee, the sum of \$50,983. being the second installment of 20% on Mr. Hill's subscription to \$250,000. St. Paul Gas Light stock, etc., as per Mr. Merriam's notice of March 3rd, enclosed herewith.

I do not make the interest on these notes in accordance with Mr. Merriam's figures, but have made the payment as advised above, and will leave you to make any adjustment of the interest which seems proper.

This sum of \$294.90 bears the same proportion to Mr. Schiff's installments of \$15,000. that the sum of \$983. bears to the total installment of \$50,000. I have preferred to work it out in this way rather than to figure the exact interest due from him.



Dear Sir:-

On the 13th of May, 1889, Mr. Hill deposited with the Central Trust Company of New York, \$100,000. Minneapolis Union R'y Co's First Mortgage 6% Gold Bonds to secure said Trust Company in its guarantee to one A. R. Ledoux, that the Great Falls Water Power and Town Site Company should pay to said Ledoux under a certain contract, certain payments aggregating \$100,000.

The Great Falls Town Site Company has paid to Ledoux \$50,000. of said payments, acknowledgments of which are in the hands of the Central Trust Company. That Company has therefore been relieved of its guarantees to the extent of \$50,000. and Mr. Hill has therefore directed them to return to me \$50,000. of said Minneapolis Union R'y Co's First Mortgage 6% Bonds, which, under that order I have received and returned to Mr. Hill's box in the Mercantile Safe Deposit Co's Vaults. The No's of the bonds so received by me and returned to his box, are 951/980, 1076/1095 inclusive. Bonds remaining in the hands of the Central Trust Co., are 1096 to 1145 inclusive.
