Yours of 29th ult at hand: and in for explanation beg to state: That my delay in sending this letter was caused by an accident that happened upon my work, by which I lost a man, and had to go and attend to that first.

And now to the farm business I would like to fence both sides of the road that runs through Mr Hill's Farm North and South which would make a fence of about 200 rods as the West side of the road should be fenced clear to the Rail Road. This as I told you I would like to have Mr Hill do or let me do it and get credit for same. Mr Hill to decide on what kind of fence to be used. or if Mr Hill should say get not to do so to grant me the privilege to put up a temporary one, and take it down when I leave the place. The fences on the farm now are Cedar posts 8 ft apart, with 5 regular fence boards and a cap board if I remember right

If you will kindly speak to Mr Hill about this and if Mr Hill will let me have the farm for one more season please let me know and I will come down to your office and sign the lease when you call on me so to do.

Let me trouble you Mr Stephens to ask Mr Hill if he would sell that 40 acres laying East of the road that I have mentioned for fencing. and which is entirely separate from the other part of this farm, and as you can see on your map that it don't touch the lake any where by several rods. Should Mr Hill see fit to sell it please let me know at what price, and greatly oblige
