Dear Sir:--

I find at the Auditorium Annex, or "CONGRESS" as they call it, that on the fifth floor apartments can be had, on the European plan, as follows:--

To better locate them I hand you herewith a diagram of the house. The rooms marked with a blue "X" are as follows:-- one parlor \$12.00, one bed-room, \$10.00, one bed-room, \$7.50 and one bed-room \$7.50, and another suite (of three rooms) one parlor, convertible into a bed-room and two bed-rooms, \$32.00, total \$69.00, or omitting the last three rooms, and substituting two inside rooms marked with a blue "O" at \$5.00 each, would make \$47.00. These rooms, as you will note, face east on Michigan and South.

Going into the south-west corner you will find four rooms marked with price; one parlor \$12.00, two bed-rooms at \$10.00 each and one at seven, total \$39.50, to which can be added one or more inside rooms at \$5.00 per day each. The rooms that have baths are so indicated on the diagram. ^{Prices} these are all by the day.

The rooms will be finely finished and I understand, elaborately furnished. The Auditorium people request an early
