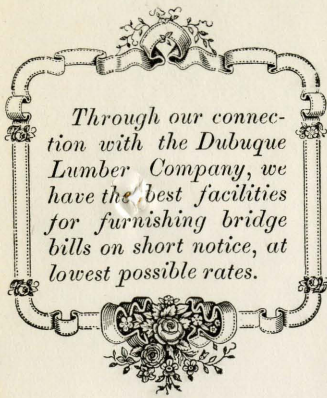

Dear Gents

You are pretty well versed with the situation up here regarding the Craig, although I have not written much on the subject. I do not understand Mr Gordon's actions. I demanded the coal of him yesterday at the N P Docks and he refused to deliver there on account of ice and the time it would take to unload. I told him there should be no delay in unloading. He ~~says~~ ^{says} we should have the coal ~~delivered~~ ^{delivered} at ~~time~~ ^{time} and would be willing to bear part of the extra expense. I telegraphed you the situation and also his reasons afterwards. I showed him your dispatch to have him deliver the coal at the N P docks and you would settle on the contract. He told me it was not so much the matter of contract as it was, that
