Thy 28th to hand. The last coal from Paul
Nov 22nd was finished a day or two
ago. All the coal on hand, now is the
Sumatra cargo. Sometime ago when there
was no other coal here, the instructions were
to use it and I supposed they continued
in force under the same circumstances.
The last few cars that have been shipped has
been that, that came from South ^{this season}. That coal is
in a bad position and the sooner it is
worked off the better. If we have a heavy
snow or a thaw, it will render it hard and
expensive to handle. I have kept an account
of this coal and if there is any trouble, could
not the coal be replaced from the Rest's
part of the Sumatra's cargo. That has been
carried all along as belonging to the Vol.
I will not ship any more but coal until
I hear from you, but if there is no difference

It would be advisable to use that part of the Sumatra's cargo
that came from the South this season. Very respectfully,
