I take the liberty of enclosing you several articles from Newspapers in Northern towns in regard to R.R. connection with the Coal field of that section - The people down there seem to be thoroughly worked up and yesterday I had a letter from Linn Co. Wakefield of this state from Blue Earth City saying that the people of his section were moving in the matter of a railroad to the down coal field -

This is one advantage I have over all other coal banks so far discovered in the west and that is the small expense in mining and putting on the cars -

In operating on a large scale I could furnish the coal on the cars all screened for \$1²⁵ per ton and this alone with the shortness of the haul would absolutely control the entire soft coal and virtually the fuel of the Southern part of the state as far north as the timber.

The Oescalooon and B.C + M coal would be entirely shut out and still leave better

I understand the line from Leavenworth on your road
South to the vicinity of Fort Dodge is graded and the
bridges in and that it can be had for a nominal
amount - It is controlled by Duncombe & Richards
of Fort Dodge. but as Mr. Duncombe is the atty of
the Ill. Cent. RR he might not wish to ally him-
self with Milwaukee interests

If your company take sufficient interest in
the matter to think of putting in a connection I think
you can have it demonstrated that you would
get 50000 tons a year to haul and in addition would
save \$150 per ton on your own coal after making an
allowance for the differences in distance from the
mines and where you now receive your coal of 50¢
per ton - I can most fully satisfy you as to the
quality of the coal and think you will find it makes as
much steam as the Indiana Block and certainly as
much as the Illinois coal from the B C & W R.R.

The large area of the field and the fact of its containing
three veins aggregating about 14 ft of good able coal is sufficient
guarantee that the mines would last and furnish a supply
for any reasonable time -
