I send you a copy of a communication just received from the collector of customs, which explains itself. He informs me he has sent the same in substance to Mr. Farley, & that it's "his ultimatum" that he would not violate the law or his own convictions for any R.R. or Steamboat Company.

It he inforces this order it seems to me the train from St. Paul will have to leave on Sunday Evening in place of Saturday; arriving Monday and not Sunday. I think Bradly will let the boat leaving Winnepeg Saturday have a clearance at New Lynne Sunday morning, and she would then be forced to lay here all day Sunday doing nothing.

If you were here, you would not be surprised that things work slowly, and it seems to me it would be better for the R.R. people to fix things just as soon as possible so we can do business promptly- instead of sending long telegrams asking why freight is not moved faster. You should see the situation to appreciate it. Some of our employees (clerks etc.) & the Custom House People walk from six to twelve miles a day between Depot and boat, aside from the time it consumes & the delay it causes, it is tiresome. I have walked it three or four times today and know how it is myself.

I don't believe Green will stand it much longer. If you can't come up next week, I think I will be down to St. Paul Wednesday or Thursday.
