Dear Sir

Yesterday Messrs
Kennedy & Co the N.Y. Agents of the Dutch Bond-
holders telegraphed their Agent here to request a
conference with yourself Mr. Finitte and ourselves
which was made known to me last evening.
This morning I telegraphed you to say that I ex-
pected to meet you in Montreal early next-
week - Mr. Kitchson has not yet returned and
I at once telegraphed him to ask him to delay his
return and join me in Montreal and I will
start at once on receipt of his reply

We received a letter from J. Carls on the 28th July
dated Utrecht July 11th informing us among other things
that in case of a sale to us, the Dutch Committee would
insist on our taking all the bonds in their hands at the
time of closing the sale provided the amount was a

fair majority of each class, and also asking to have the offer held good for two months; to which we replied by Cable Aug 1st "Conditions of our letter May 26th good until Sept 10th" and wrote under same date to say that we wanted an early and definite reply and that their reply should contemplate substantially the amount of each class of bonds named in our letter of May 26th.

This letter they would receive about the 18th or 19th and the request for conference leads us to think they intend accepting offer. The present splendid crop of this State has already caused numerous inquiries for lands of this Company and we think that every indication favors a very busy season next year.

I will take all correspondence with you to Montreal and after you have looked it over will be better able to advise us. We look forward with great pleasure to your proposed visit as we feel quite sure it will take personal inspection to fully appreciate the extent and value of this property and we would greatly prefer that you would see before any final action. I wrote Mr Smith today and told him that there was no reason for him to change his present
