application for work this spring, but
Mr. Keil informed him, his request
came too late. He understood that
Rome's health did not permit him to
come out this winter and he would
like his job. He proposes to do the
same work as Rome did for

\$50 ^{per} month (25 ^{less} than Rome had)
He will find all the leaves around
here just as cheap as Rome's leaves
were. Rome took all his wages,
as well as the earnings of all his
leaves in Cash away from here,
but if you employ franks he
& his leavesmen (who will be
farmers) will probably trade it
all (or the largest portion of it).
The farmers round here who trade
with us during the summer and
give us their Cash, are certainly
deserving of work if they do it
as cheap & as good as outsiders.

I mean the kind of farmers who
patronize us, not the kind who
indulge in writing threatening letters
or getting up lawsuits.

Mr. Carman further states that
he sunk all in that Black

Hill speculation, he has no leaves
and his wife is expected to be
rich and they are destitute.
He has traded with us hundreds
of Dollars & has stuck to us
always. Therefore, gentlemen, I
would recommend giving him
the job as an act of charity &
justice to him, and an act of
economy & profit to the firm.
I have no doubt will be of
great advantage in making the
firm popular & consequently
increasing their profits.
