The Scho

Janu Bell arrived just before dinner.
The coal is the kind you described, is a
rich looking coal, not so much actual dust
immediately under the hatch as small
coal, the size of a walnut and up. It
improved very much in size after a couple
hours work. We have not accomplished
a great deal at loading cars today. Load-
ing Merchandise on the Sauter truck and
the Prop & Paul taking flour on the other side
so that the coal had a poor show.
Quite a sea outside ^{so} that they were obliged
to load the flour from the warehouse into
cars and transfer it to the N P dock. We
got six cars about 11 A M and stole
three this afternoon. If they leave the
empty cars anywhere near us without
an engine attached to them, we can shove

them to the coal dock and weigh
the coal in. Whenever the report shows
less than between 16 or 20 cars, you may
know we are not getting sufficient
cars for our present force. Last week
we paid for 1039 tons and loaded
about 120 cars and then did
not work full time. I loaded two cars
for the Minneapolis Gas Co this evening
but are not weighed yet. There is about
17 cars due them. I am very anxious
to get it off before snow comes and will
endeavor to load more or less for them
every day. Your telegram to hand. There
is no empties here at present, as they ^{have} been
unloaded nothing. As soon as they get some
empties they will give them to us. The Mer-
chandise is all gone and there is no
other use for them unless they send them
away empty.
