I have been so busy for several days in preparing full accounts of the International railway situation for the State Department that I did not hear of your departure for New York and Washington until yesterday. Calling to show you a fuller abstract of Mr. Mills' Colonization Railroad Bill I was informed of your absence from town.

When you reach Washington, you will find Mr. S. W. Leonard 1st Ass't. Secretary of State fully posted and I doubt not that he will be disposed to aid your views in extending the grant

of lands in favor of the St. P. & P. —
whatever he may think of other
Land grants.

I suppose Mr. Smith will
be with you in New York : and
so enclose a letter to him. We
have cooperated so long and
cordially, that I make a personal
request — encouraged by what
Mr. Kilmer and himself have
said — and feel encouraged
to repeat the request to you. It
is, that in the reorganization
of the company after foreclosure
or whenever it takes place, I may
receive some position which will
enable me to live in St. Paul with
my family : and that meanwhile,
you and your associates will recog-
nize what I have done and may
do for your interest, by a monthly
allowance of \$50, or \$800 for the
year 1878. Before my appointment
as Consul, the St. P. & P. made me

a similar allowance for special services. Allow me to urge the renewal of the arrangement?

Especially for the current year, shall I need such an allowance: as my daughter Hatty is prostrated by her devotion and exposures as teacher in the public schools: and I desire, above all things, to do every thing possible for her recovery.

I have no particular expression of your views of this matter: but I will not allow myself to doubt your favorable consideration of my request.
