My dear Mr. Swift:

Thank you for your very thoughtful note and enclosure, regarding visit of the Prince of Wales and Premier Baldwin.

We are building a new hotel in Canada, in the Province of Alberta, about seventy-five miles south of High River, where the Prince has his Canadian cattle ranch. As the hotel is expected to be opened in early July, we are, of course, hopeful that on the visit to High River Ranch, the Prince and his party may also visit our hotel, but we are not contemplating issuing any invitation or in any way annoying the Prince by giving any publicity to the fact that we have a hotel named for him or that we hope he will visit, etc., for the reason that any publicity could not help but be annoying, as if the approximate date were announced we would have a very large number of curious people, which could readily prevent the party from making a visit, etc. However, I do appreciate the copy of the schedule and we will certainly try to do our part if the opportunity presents. I may be misinformed, but I am quite certain the Prince would much prefer to visit the hotel on Waterton Lake "incog" and unexpectedly so that people in the near vicinity would not be present to crowd, annoy, etc.

I am enclosing you a small booklet giving some idea of the new hotel.

I wired you this date as follows, which I now
beg to confirm:

"In conference with Mr. Hill and Mr. Kenney this morning it was decided to accept proposition contained in memorandum made by us at Calgary on the 9th instant. Our Mr. Hogg will work out legal details with you. We are extremely anxious that work be started on the highway immediately and will feel obligated if you will have the work started, formal agreement to follow and to be worked out between Government and Mr. Hogg as soon as possible."

In considering the memorandum made on the 9th in conference here today, it was found to be acceptable and it was felt that your Government had gone as far as you could go under the circumstances, and we very much appreciate your action and the friendly spirit with which your Government is meeting our enterprise.

I hope you will see your way clear to start work on the highway at once. I am committing the matter of working out the legal details and formulating contract for execution to our Counsel, Mr. Hogg, who will at once get in touch with you for that purpose.

As I stated in Calgary, I do not think it will be necessary to delay work on the highway until formal agreement is executed as the Hotel Company stands ready to execute the agreement in line with the memorandum as soon as it has been prepared, and transmitted to St. Paul.

Dear Sir:

Attached is copy of memorandum made at meeting of Mr. Hogeland and myself with the Prime Minister and Minister of Public Works at Calgary on the 9th instant.

The proposition contained in this memorandum has been approved by Mr. Hill and Mr. Kenney, and I have wired the Prime Minister today accepting this memorandum. I was assured by Mr. MacPherson, the Minister of Public Works that if the proposition contained in this memorandum was accepted by us that the Government would proceed immediately with the work of improving this highway.

Will you please transmit this memorandum that I am giving you, and also memorandum of the proposed agreement, to Mr. Hogg and request him to immediately get in touch with the Government and work out a formal agreement along the lines of the memorandum made in Calgary, for the approval by the Government and transmit it to Mr. F. G. Dorety, our General Counsel at St. Paul, who will obtain execution thereof?

Will you also please have Mr. Hogg urge upon the Government authorities our desire to have the work commenced immediately? In talking with Mr. MacPherson at Calgary, he stated there would be no objection to starting the work before execution of the formal agreement.

I am particularly anxious that Mr. Hogg shall fully satisfy himself of the legal authority to issue the bonds under existing legislation. I discussed this matter with Mr. MacPherson and he said he was satisfied that some legal way could be found to meet this issue. Mr. Hogg was of the same opinion. In order to make the bonds marketable, it is very necessary that legal authority to issue same shall be clear.

MEMORANDUM OF PROPOSED AGREEMENT

BETWEEN:

The Province of Alberta,

- and -

The Canadian Rockies Hotel Company, Limited.

(1) The Province will immediately commence the improvement and relocation as may be required of the highway between Cardston and the boundary of the Waterton Lakes Park, a distance of approximately 28 miles. Said highway to be improved according to specifications to be agreed upon between the Minister of Public Works of the Province and the Chief Engineer of the Canadian Rockies Hotel Company, Limited. Said specifications shall conform to the Province's standards of construction. Said work of construction and improvement of said highway shall be proceeded with diligently and to be completed as soon as practicable, and in any event not later than June 15, 1928.

It is estimated that the cost of said work will not exceed the sum of \$150,000.00.

(2) The Province shall issue in payment for said work its 15 year, 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ % Gold Bonds, interest payable semi-annually, and the Hotel Company will purchase said Bonds as issued at par, same to be issued and paid for as follows:

For each \$25,000.00 expended on said work, \$25,000.00 of said bonds will be issued and delivered to the Hotel Company, and the Hotel Company shall pay for said issue the sum of \$25,000.00 in cash. The Certificate of the Minister of Public Works of the Province that the amount of \$25,000.00 has been expended will be taken by

the Hotel Company as sufficient to obligate it to purchase that amount of bonds. Said bonds as to be issued shall draw interest at the rate of 4½% per annum from January 1, 1929, and the interest due thereon shall be evidenced by coupons. The first coupon to become due and payable on July 1, 1929 for the six months interest preceeding that date. And the total amount of bonds to be issued to be equal to the cost of said work and shall not exceed \$150,000.00.

(3) If the proposition stated in the foregoing memorandum is accepted by both parties thereto, same shall be expressed by formal written agreement.
