In answer to yours of April 23rd to Mr. Hogg of Lethbridge, I would have written you sooner only I have been away from the ranch.

I have known Mr. Hogg for about 20 years and requested him to try and locate you for me. It has been my intentions for years to start a Dude ranch in Alberta, but as we have not been favored with good crops in this district for the last few years I am lacking the necessary capital.

While in the East this winter I was surprised at the interest taken in your Radio hour on the Oriental Limited and the West. I tried to see you on my return to the West but you were out of town at the time.

Now I had an idea that you might be interested in starting a Dude ranch in the Pincher Creek district in connection with your hotel at Waterton Lakes. As you might know we haven't such a resort in the whole of Canada, and the better ranches of this kind in the United States are booked up a year in advance. The ranch life appeals to the big business man who has had about everything money can buy, and this life would interest him more than ever in Canada as he would be able to have his high-ball before supper.

It would be my idea to look after the ranch and the guests during the tourist season and then go East in the winter months and book up our guests for the following year.

Mr. Hill I feel confident I could make a ranch of this kind a great success for your Company and bring a lot of people over your road and would like to make it my life's work.
