

GUIDEBOOKS.

70U will add greatly to the enjoyment of your trip if you will procure a guidebook of the park, and refer to it as you go from one point of interest to another. At the offices of the transportation company at Cody, West Yellowstone, and Mammoth Hot Springs, at the Government information office, and at the ranger stations the National Park Service distributes free of charge a Government booklet describing all of the interesting features of the park, the geyser and hot spring phenomena, the canyons, lakes, mountains, and fish. This booklet also contains the rules and regulations of the park. It has a few illustrations.

The Haynes Guidebook, an elaborately illustrated volume, is on sale in the hotels, camps, stores, information office, and picture shops at 75 cents.

MANUAL FOR RAILR AD VISITORS

You have just entered Yellowstone National Park. In bidding you welcome, the National Park Service asks you to remember that you are visiting a great playground that belongs in part to you, and that while you are at liberty to go anywhere in the park with perfect freedom, you owe it to yourself and to your fellow citizens to do nothing that will injure any of the natural features of the park, the geyser and hot spring formations, the trees, the wild animals, or birds.

The park was set apart from the public domain by Congress in 1872 and dedicated as a "pleasuring ground for the benefit and enjoyment of the people." It was enacted that it should remain forever as such. Thus we of the present generation are obliged legally and morally to so use and enjoy the park

that it will remain forever in essentially its natural state.

Help us, then, protect Yellowstone National Park and especially its things of beauty that are so often desecrated by the carved initial or other inscription.

THE FIRE DANGER.

The area of the park is 3,348 square miles, or 2,142,720 acres. Over 85 per cent of this great reservation is covered with dense forests of pine, fir, spruce, and other trees. You will pass through some of these vast forests in your tour of the park, and you are particularly urged to use the greatest caution in handling matches, cigar and cigarette stubs, and pipe ashes. Extinguish every spark before throwing them away. In one year 306 fires in Yellowstone Park were caused by careless handling of matches and stubs of cigars and cigarettes. Many tourists found responsible for these fires suffered arrest for violation of the regulations, then trial, and the imposition of heavy fines for their negligence.

You can not be too careful with fire.

GRAND TOUR OF YELLOWSTONE NATIONAL PARK

Thousands of visitors to Yellowstone National Park coming by rail choose the 4½ days' sightseeing tour, using the busses of the Yellowstone Park Transportation Co. and the accommodations of either the hotel system or the system of permanent camps.

The regular tickets for this tour cover transportation service and 14 meals and 4 lodgings in either

hotels or permanent camps.

When passengers use "A" Tours as designated on pages 5 and 6, requiring less than 14 meals, refund will be made of charge for one meal in case of Tours 1A, 3A, 5A, 6A, 13A, 14A, and two meals in case of Tours 2A, 4A. Such refund will be made by representative of Yellowstone Park Hotel Co., or Camps Co., as the case may be, when passenger's rail coupon is exchanged at Mammoth Hot Springs or West Yellowstone.

When passengers elect to change from Camp Tour to Hotel Tour, or vice versa, adjustment will be made by Hotel Co. or Camps Co., as case may be, on basis of service performed on American plan,

from time of registration until checking out.

Passengers may remain in Yellowstone Park as long as desired, within the park season, upon the payment of the regular rates for additional hotel or camp accommodations, but without additional charge for automobile transportation via route of the regular Yellowstone Park Tours.

TOUR RATES.

The cost of the 41/2 days' tour via hotels is \$54.00, covering transportation, meals, and lodgings for the complete tour. The lodgings for this tour are those provided for in the minimum American plan, hotel rate of \$6.50 per day, and do not include bath. The American plan hotel rates per day, per person, providing for room with private

1 person in a room, \$10.00 to \$11.00, according to location.

2 persons in one room, \$9.00 to \$10.00, according to location.

4 persons in two rooms, with bath between, \$8.50 to \$9.00, according to location.

5 or more persons in three or more rooms en suite with

one bath, \$7.50 to \$8.00 per person.

When rooms with bath are used, an allowance of \$6.50

per day will be made to the holder of the \$54.00 ticket.

The cost of the 4½ days' tour via the permanent camps is \$45.00, covering transportation, meals, and lodgings for the complete tour.

RAILROAD TRAIN SERVICE D THE PARK SEASON

The Yellowstone National Park season is June 18 to September 19, inclusive. The first date that passengers can leave Gardiner, West Yellowstone, Cody, or Jackson Lake (Moran), and make a tour of Yellowstone Park, is June 18.

The last date that passengers can arrive at Gardiner, West Yellowstone, Cody, or Jackson Lake

(Moran), and make a tour of Yellowstone Park, is September 15.

Last date automobiles will reach Gardiner, West Yellowstone, Cody, or Jackson Lake (Moran), after tour of Yellowstone Park, will be September 19.

IMPORTANT RULES AND REGULATIONS TO KEEP IN MIND

FIRE, DESECRATION, ARREST, FINE, IMPRISONMENT.

The following sections of the rules and regulations which are the law of the park should ever be

kept in mind and faithfully observed:

1. Preservation of natural features and curiosities.—It is forbidden to remove or injure the sediments or incrustations around the geysers, hot springs, or steam vents; or to deface the same by written inscriptions or otherwise; or to throw any object or substance into the springs or steam vents; or to injure or disturb in any manner or to carry off any of the mineral deposits, specimens, natural curiosities, or wonders within the park; or to ride or drive upon any of the geyser or hot spring formations; or to turn stock loose to graze in their vicinity.

The destruction, injury, defacement, or disturbance in any way of the public buildings, signs, equipment, or other property, or the trees, flowers, vegetation, rocks, mineral, animal or bird or other life is prohibited: *Provided*, That flowers may be gathered in small quantities when, in the judgment of the superintendent, their removal will not impair the beauty of the park.

3. Fires.—Fires constitute one of the greatest perils to the park; they shall not be kindled near trees, dead wood, moss, dry leaves, forest mold, or other vegetable refuse, but in some open space on rocks or earth. Should camp be made in a locality where no such open space exists or is provided, the dead wood, moss, dry leaves, etc., shall be scraped away to the rock or earth over an area considerably larger than that required for

Any person who violates any of the foregoing regulations shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be subject to a fine of not more than \$500 or imprisonment not exceeding six months, or both, and be adjudged to pay all costs of the proceedings. the fire. Fires shall be lighted only when necessary, and when no longer needed shall be completely extinguished and all embers and bed smothered with earth or water so that there remains no possibility of reignition.

Especial care shall be taken that no lighted match, cigar, or cigarette is dropped in any

grass, twigs, leaves, or tree mold.

5. Bears.—Molesting or teasing the bears is

prohibited.

6. Fishing.—Fishing with nets, seines, traps, or by the use of drugs or explosives, or in any other way than with hook and lines, or for merchandise or profit is prohibited. Fishing in particular waters may be suspended by the superintendent, who may also designate waters which shall be reserved exclusively for fishing with the artificial fly. All fish hooked less than 8 inches long shall be carefully handled with moist hands and returned at once to the water, if not seriously injured. Fish retained should be killed.

Ten fish per person shall constitute the limit for

a day's catch.

17. Fines and penalties.—Persons who render themselves obnoxious by disorderly conduct or bad behavior shall be subjected to the punishment hereinafter prescribed for violation of the foregoing regulations, or they may be summarily removed from the park by the superintendent and not allowed to return without permission in writing from the Director of the National Park Service or the superintendent of the park.

Any person who violates any of the foregoing regulations shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be subject to a fine of not more than \$500 or imprisonment not exceeding six months, or both, and be adjudged to pay all costs of the proceedings.

Column 7.—Passengers are invited to enter in this column the actual arriving time of their cars at the different stations. By checking this time against column 5 you can tell whether you are running on schedule or not.





GENERAL INFORMATION

THE TRANSPORTATION LINE.

You are riding in automobiles operated by the Yellowstone Park Transportation Co., which holds a franchise from the Federal Government permitting it to conduct a transportation business on the park road system. The national park authorities prescribe the character of service that this company must give to the public, and all rates are approved by the Director of the National Park Service.

These cars were specially constructed for park touring and are constantly inspected by park officials.

These cars do not have the right of way on the park roads, but have the same privileges with respect to the use of the roads and the speed limits that are accorded all other automobiles. Your driver is experienced in operating cars on mountain roads, and he is specifically instructed to adhere strictly to all speed and other regulations.

THE SPEED LIMITS.

The speed limit is 12 miles per hour on grades and when rounding sharp curves. On good roads with straight stretches and when no vehicle is nearer than 200 yards the maximum limit is 25 miles per hour.

If these limits are exceeded you may be in danger of accident, and you should insist upon slower operation of the car. You would also perform a public service if you would report the driver's violation of the regulations at the next hotel or camp, or by telephone to the park authorities, giving the driver's number for identification purposes.

If the driver neglects or refuses to stop at any point of interest indicated on the map herein you should insist on his immediate compliance with his instructions.

ADMINISTRATION OF THE PARK.

Yellowstone National Park is in charge of the superintendent, Mr. Horace M. Albright, whose office is at Mammoth Hot Springs, the park head-quarters. Complaints and suggestions should be addressed to this officer in writing. The telephone service is also available for notifying the superintendent or nearest ranger station for emergency complaints regarding reckless driving on the roads reports of forest fires, etc.

PROTECTION OF THE PARK-THE RANGER SERVICE.

The park is protected by the ranger force under the direction of the superintendent. The principal duties of the rangers include the patrolling of the roads and trails, control of automobile traffic, protection of the geyser and hot spring formations, sanitation of camps, etc., but they also answer inquiries and give general information regarding the park as opportunity permits. Do not hesitate to consult the rangers. They are here to aid you. Ranger stations are situated near every hotel and camp and at every junction point on the road system.

THE GUIDE AND LECTURE SERVICE.

In order to more completely inform Yellowstone Park visitors regarding the natural features of the park, the National Park Service has established a nature guide service at Mammoth Hot Springs, at Old Faithful, and at Camp Roosevelt, where guides and lecturers are maintained on the ranger force to explain and interpret these features to the public. Trips are made afield, and are so arranged as to be available to everybody. This service is free, as are the lectures given in the evening at headquarters (Mammoth Hot Springs) on the history, geology, flora, and fauna of the park.

INFORMATION AND MUSEUM OFFICE.

At park headquarters, Mammoth Hot Springs, there is a combined museum and information office in the building at the north end of old Fort Yellowstone. Maps and other publications relating to all of the national parks of the United States are available in this office.

MEDICAL AND HOSPITAL SERVICE.

The medical service of Yellowstone National Park has its headquarters at Mammoth Hot Springs where physicians and a surgeon of long professional experience are constantly available for attention to park visitors. A well-equipped hospital with trained nurses and other skilled personnel is a part of this service. A fine ambulance is kept in readiness for instant service.

Physicians of the medical service staff will promptly attend patients at any place in the park upon call. Trained nurses are also stationed in each hotel and permanent camp, except at Mammoth Hot Springs, and these establishments are provided with adequately equipped dispensaries.

In case of accident or illness requiring the service of a physician or nurse, you should proceed at once to the nearest hotel, permanent camp, or ranger station, where medical service can be summoned by telephone.

Rates for medical and hospital service are the same as prevailing rates in cities near the park.

DENTAL SERVICE.

As this publication goes to press, arrangements are being made for dental service during the season of 1926, and it is believed such service will be available.

LOST AND FOUND ARTICLES.

Persons finding lost articles should deposit them at the nearest ranger station, leaving their own names and addresses, so that if not claimed by owners within 60 days articles may be turned over to those who found them. Also, if you have lost anything ask the ranger about it, or inquire at the information office at Mammoth.

THE PARK MILEPOST SYSTEM.

The milepost signs in Yellowstone National Park are diamond-shaped steel signs with raised letters, which are in every case initials of a junction point on the loop road system or a park gateway. The following is a key to the milepost initials:

N. E North entrance at Gardiner, Mont.

W. E___ West entrance at West Yellowstone, Mont.

E. E. ... East entrance near Cody, Wyo.
S. E. ... South entrance near Moran, Wyo.
M. S. ... Mammoth Hot Springs where the north approach road joins the loop system.

N. J ... Norris Junction near Norris Geyser Basin where a road leads directly across the park to the Grand Canyon of the Yellowstone.

M. J Madison Junction where the west approach road joins the loop system.

O. F ... Old Faithful at the head of Upper Geyser Basin. W. T ... West Thumb of Yellowstone Lake where the south approach road joins the loop system.

L. J.___ Lake Junction where the east or Cody approach road joins the loop system.

C. J___ Canyon Junction where a road leads directly across the park from the Grand Canyon of the Yellowstone to Norris Basin.

T. J .__ Tower Falls Junction where the road to the buffalo ranch and Cooke City leaves the loop system.

Mt. W__ Summit of Mount Washburn.

There is a ranger station at each of the above

entrances and junction points.

As the map in the front of this booklet clearly shows, the main road system of Yellowstone Park is roughly in the form of a figure 8. This system is called the "loop" or "belt-line" road. There are 140.6 miles of improved highways in the main system.

The approach roads are the feeders to the loop system, and they lead from all four park gateways to junction points as above indicated. The aggregate length of the approach roads in the park is 68.3 miles.

Other roads in the park have a combined length of 92.3 miles.

Outside of the park boundaries, by special authority of Congress, the National Park Service maintains 28 miles of the east approach road in the Shoshone National Forest and 30 miles of the south approach road in the Teton National Forest.

STOP-OVER PRIVILEGES.

Yellowstone National Park is an ideal vacation resort. It is worth your time for a week, a month,

or, indeed, the entire park season.

The four and one-half day's tour is properly designated as a "sight-seeing tour." It represents the minimum time for a circuit of the park loop with one-night stops at each center of scenic interest. While this tour is satisfactory from the standpoint of giving the visitors a general knowledge of the phenomena and primary scenic attractions of the park, it must of necessity fall far short of giving the visitors the benefits which follow a leisurely visit with time for healthful and recreational pastimes in the high, dry, pineladen air of this great nature playground. You owe it to yourself to stop over at the hotels or camps as many additional days as your vacation allowance will permit. These stop-overs do not entail additional transportation expense. Each hotel and permanent camp is a center from which radiate roads and trails for automobiles, saddlehorse, walking, and fishing trips. On Yellowstone Lake are boats for scenic excursions and fishing.

The attention of all visitors is especially directed to Camp Roosevelt, a unique and comfortable camp near Tower Falls on the loop road. This camp is named in commemoration of the visit of President Roosevelt to this region in April, 1903. Camp Roosevelt is a resort center for visitors who desire to get off the beaten path and enjoy to the full the stimulating climate and activities which this camp affords. It is headquarters for trips to Grasshopper Glacier, Fossil Forest, and fishing trips to near-by trout streams. In addition, it appeals to visitors who are seeking rest and less strenuous recreation. An additional attraction is the natural hot sulphur baths.

VALIDATION OF TICKETS.

Tickets to Cody, Wyo., Gardiner, Mont., West Yellowstone, Mont., Lander, Wyo., or Yellowstone National Park, Wvo., may be validated for return passage as follows:

(a) By railroad agent at Cody, Wyo., Gardiner, Mont., West Yellowstone, Mont., or Lander, Wyo. (b) Mammoth Hot Springs or Old Faithful.

(c) Tickets to West Yellowstone, Mont., or Yellowstone Park, Wyo. (both ways via West Yellowstone), will also be validated at Ashton, Idaho Falls, or Pocatello, Idaho.

BAGGAGE AT GATEWAY RAILROAD STATIONS.

Baggage for passengers entering Yellowstone Park via Gardiner, Mont., should be checked to Gardiner, Mont.; for passengers entering Yellowstone Park via West Yellowstone, Mont., should be checked to West Yellowstone, Mont.; for passengers entering Yellowstone Park via Cody, Wyo., should be checked to Cody, Wyo.; and for passengers entering Yellowstone Park via Lander. Wyo., should be checked to Lander, Wyo.

Entering via Gardiner, leaving via West Yellowstone, baggage may be checked to Gardiner or via the Northern Pacific Railway to Butte and the Union Pacific System to West Yellowstone, or it may be rechecked at Gardiner to West Yellowstone. If baggage has been taken to Mammoth Hot Springs, it can be checked from that point to West Yellowstone upon payment of usual charge from Mammoth Hot Springs to Gardiner.

Entering via Gardiner, leaving via Lander, baggage may be checked to Gardiner or via the Chicago & North Western Railway to Lander.


Entering via West Yellowstone, leaving via Gardiner, baggage may be checked to West Yellowstone, Mont., or via the Union Pacific System to Butte and Northern Pacific Railway to Gardiner, or it may be rechecked at West Yellowstone to Gardiner via Butte. Passengers desiring to have their baggage delivered at Mammoth Hot Springs can arrange to have it brought from Gardiner by notifying the transportation company and paying the usual charge.

Entering via West Yellowstone, leaving via Cody, baggage may be checked to West Yellowstone or to Cody, or it may be rechecked at West Yellowstone to Cody via Union Pacific System to Butte, Northern Pacific Railway to Billings, and

Chicago, Burlington & Quincy Railroad. Entering via West Yellowstone, leaving via Lander, baggage may be checked to West Yellowstone or via the Chicago & North Western Rail-

way to Lander.

Entering via Cody, leaving via Gardiner, or entering via Gardiner and leaving via Cody, baggage may be checked to Cody or Gardiner, or it may be rechecked at Cody via Chicago, Burlington & Quincy Railroad to Billings and Northern Pacific Railway to Gardiner, or at Gardiner via



Entering via Cody, leaving via West Yellowstone, baggage may be checked to Cody, or via Butte and Union Pacific System to West Yellowstone, or it may be rechecked at Cody to West Yellowstone via Chicago, Burlington & Quincy Railroad to Billings, Northern Pacific Railway to Butte, and Union Pacific System.

Entering via Cody, leaving via Lander, baggage may be checked to Cody or via the Chicago & North Western Railway to Lander, or it may be rechecked from Cody to Lander via Orin.

Entering via Lander, leaving via West Yellowstone, baggage may be checked to Lander or West Yellowstone.

Entering via Lander, leaving via Gardiner, baggage may be checked to Lander or Gardiner.

Entering via Lander, leaving via Cody, baggage may be checked to Lander or Cody, or it may be rechecked from Lander to Cody via Orin.

BAGGAGE IN YELLOWSTONE NATIONAL PARK.

The Yellowstone Park Transportation Co. will carry not to exceed 25 pounds of hand baggage free. Passengers entering Yellowstone Park at Cody who desire their trunks in the park may arrange at Cody to have their baggage rechecked free to Gardiner for carriage into Yellowstone Park. A charge of \$1 in each direction is made for the transportation of each trunk on regular baggage wagon between Gardiner and Mammoth Hot Springs. Special arrangements may be made for the transportation of trunks through Yellowstone Park from Gardiner, West Yellowstone, Cody, or Lander.

The Lander-Yellowstone Transportation Co. will carry not to exceed 25 pounds of hand bag-

gage free from Lander to Moran.

The liability of the Yellowstone Park Transportation Co. for loss of or damage to suitcase or grip is limited to \$25, and for loss of or damage to trunk liability is limited to \$100. Passengers desiring additional protection to baggage may obtain an insurance policy at small cost from the transportation agent at the park gateways, or in the park at the various stations.

STORAGE OF BAGGAGE WHILE ON PARK TOUR.

Storage charges on baggage will be waived at Livingston, Gardiner, West Yellowstone, Pocatello, Idaho Falls, Ogden, Salt Lake City, Lander, Cody, Frannie, or Billings or at Butte (Chicago, Milwaukee & St. Paul) while passengers are making the park trip.

AUTHORIZED RATES FOR PUBLIC UTILITIES

Remember that all rates are approved by the Government. Complaints regarding overcharges should be made to the superintendent. Employees of the hotels, camps, and transportation lines are not Government employees, but discourteous treatment by public-utility employees should be reported to the park administration.

HOTELS AND CAMPS. YELLOWSTONE PARK HOTEL CO.

The four hotels in the park are maintained by the Yellowstone Park Hotel Co. These are located at Mammoth Hot Springs, the Upper Geyser Basin, the outlet of Yellowstone Lake, and the Grand Canyon of the Yellowstone.

The address of the hotel company is Yellowstone Park, Wyo., from June 15 to September 20, and Helena, Mont., thereafter. The authorized
