Dear Reverend Maier:

I was glad that Trudy Rowen and I could attend service on All Saints Day and meet you at coffee.

You said that you took some of the youngsters on a tour of the cemetery, and that you called their attention to the medals on the Dwight stones. I believe I told you that I was Mrs. Dwight's relative and that I was brought up by them. I was in the choir from 1914 to 1917.

Col. Dwight's medal is the British Distinguish Cross given by Winston S. Churchill on July 10th, 1919. He was also cited by General John F. Pershing. For many years starting in 1914 Col. Dwight was active on the Vestry and Cemetery work. He was also a Chevalier of the Legion of Honor. He died on April 1st, 1946.

Jane Reed Dwight's medal is the Croix De Guerre, presented by Marshal Petain and she was cited by the British for The Order of the British Empire. She was very active in the Altar Guild at All Saints. When the church was remodeled for the organ, a number of her family and friends donated the funds for completely rebuilding the Vestry Room, used by the Altar Guild. I believe there is a list behind a hinged part of the wall-probably where the name is carved.

Col. Dwight gave the magnificent organ in her memory which was dedicated on November 17th, 1929. I'm sure your fine organist will enjoy reading about the Organ and the Dwights. Some of your congregation will know the names of the choir at the Dedication. Please thank Mrs. Imperatore for the list of old timers. Sincerely,
