Dear Mr. Hyde:

After payment of funeral expenses and all known debts, estimated provision for all estate taxes and other proper charges of administration and satisfaction of prior legacies under the Will of Colonel Dwight, the Executors are now prepared to make a distribution on account to the legatees named in Article "Sixth" of the Will, in the amount of their respective proportionate shares of a total sum of \$150,000. However, in the case of any of said legatees who is an infant, such payment can only be made to his or her guardian duly appointed and qualified to act in New York.

By the terms of said Article "Sixth", your proportionate share of the above-mentioned sum is (1/8th of 7%) or \$1312.50.

We enclose an estate check to your order for said amount, together with a form of receipt for such payment, which we shall be obliged if you will sign and return to us. Please also advise us if we are to make any change in your address as shown above for purpose of further communications.



Shortly after April 1st, next, when the Federal and New York estate tax returns have been filed in the usual course, the Executors hope to be able to make some further distribution on account to the legatees under Article "Sixth", after reserving from the liquid assets then on hand, an amount sufficient in the judgment of the Executors to provide for any unpaid expenses or possible claims in connection with the administration of the estate. However, the final settlement of the estate will have to await the determination of the Federal and New York estate taxes, on an audit of the returns by the tax authorities, which usually requires a considerable period of time after the returns have been filed as mentioned above.

A separate administration proceedings was necessary in Illinois and the distributive share has nothing to do with any interest other than that of your son in the Illinois real estate.

Dear Mr. Hyde:

We are writing you in connection with the interest of your son, Arthur Dwight Hyde, Jr., in the above estate. We understand that your son is still a minor and no payment has been made on account of his legacy under the terms of subdivision (k) of Article Sixth of Col. Dwight's will, because no guardian has been appointed in New York to receive such payment on behalf of your son while still a minor.

In view of your own interest under the terms of subdivision (e) of Article Sixth, we believe you are aware of the present situation regarding the payment of legacies under said article. In other words, the Executors have heretofore made distributions to the adult legatees and to those infants for whom New York guardians have been appointed, on the basis of a total distribution of \$250,000. on account of the legacies provided for by Article Sixth. On the same basis, we compute that under subdivision (k) of Article Sixth, your son would be entitled to one-third of \$5,000., or \$1,666.67, on account of his maximum legacy of \$2,000. The amount of any further distribution will, of course, depend on the outcome of the tax litigation which is still pending and will probably not be determined before the end of this year.

In anticipation of the ultimate settlement of the estate, we have been arranging with the parents of the various infant legatees, to secure their appointment as guardians in New York. Whether it would be advisable to take the same course with regard to your son, would seem to depend on his present age. In other words, if your son is approaching the age of twenty-one, it would hardly seem advisable at this time to take the steps necessary to have a guardian appointed for him. Therefore, we shall be obliged if you will let us know the date of your son's birth, so that we may consider that question and write you further about it. Another question which has arisen concerns the trust of \$300,000, provided by the terms of the Article Fifth of the will, for the benefit of Mrs. Dwight. That trust was set up in July, 1946, by the payment from the estate of \$300,000. to the Guaranty Trust Company of New York and Mr. Benson, as the trustees appointed by the will. By the terms of the trust, the corpus of the fund is directed to be distributed, after Mrs. Dwight's death, among various named persons and one educational institution, in certain specified percentages. It is further provided that in case any of the named individuals should predecease Mrs. Dwight, their shares be paid to their issue who shall survive Mrs. Dwight.

Your son is not named in the will as a beneficiary of such trust fund. However, several of the individuals who are named as beneficiaries, after the death of Mrs. Dwight, have no issue, and it is therefore possible that if any of such individuals should predecease Mrs. Dwight without leaving any issue her surviving, a question would

arise as to the disposition of their shares in the corpus of the trust fund. It is also possible, owing to the provisions of the will, that there may be a small undistributed surplus of the share directed to be paid to the educational institution referred to above. In any such contingency, the court would have to decide, after the death of Mrs. Dwight, as to how any remaining surplus of the trust fund should be divided. As Mrs. Dwight is still living, any such question of possible future distribution cannot now be determined.

The trustees of the trust for Mrs. Dwight are proposing to file in the Surrogate's Court an intermediate account of their proceedings, covering the period from the date of their appointment in May, 1946, down to about March 20, 1950. In connection with such an accounting proceeding, and in view of the procedural requirements, the trustees consider it advisable to give notice of the accounting to all persons who might possibly be entitled to share in the fund under any contingency, after the death of Mrs. Dwight. In that connection, it would seem that if the distribution of the available assets in the general estate should be insufficient to pay the maximum legacy of \$2,000. to your son, any unpaid balance of that legacy might be payable, if the Surrogate's Court should so decide, out of any surplus which may remain undisposed of under the terms of the trust, after the death of Mrs. Dwight. Therefore, we wish to make your son a party to the intermediate accounting proceedings.

For that purpose, we shall need to know the age of your

son, as referred to above, and whether he now resides with you. In case your son does not reside with you at present, we shall need to know the name and address of the person or persons with whom he is actually residing. We shall also need to know whether your son now has any general or testamentary guardian appointed anywhere outside of New York.

We shall be obliged if you will write us as to the information indicated above at your earliest possible convenience.





Re: Estate of Arthur S. Dwight

The Will of Mr. Dwight gives you the following benefits:

1. Article 6 (e) provides for a $\frac{1}{8}$ interest in 7% of the property passing according to Article 6 but not to exceed $\frac{1}{8}$ of \$40,000. The total maximum dollar bequests according to Article 6 appear to be \$477,500. 7% of this amount is \$33,425. According to Article 6 (3) you are entitled to $\frac{1}{8}$ of \$33,425, but not to exceed $\frac{1}{8}$ of \$40,000.

2. The residuary clause (Article 8) includes the remainder of Mr. Dwight's estate and any lapsed legacies or devises. 10% of the residue is to go to yourself and the same persons in the same shares as named in Article 6 (e).

The \$700 check which you have just received represents $\frac{1}{8}$ of \$5,600, which is in turn 7% of \$80,000. The letter from the New York lawyers indicates that this sum represents the amount of certain tax refunds and interest.

The executors of the will have asked for approval of their account to February 15, 1955. I do not know whether you have received a copy of the account. The legal notice sent to you would indicate that this is not a final account, but only an intermediate account. I believe that it would be advisable to ask for a copy of the account. ✓

The Executors of the will have asked for directions from the Probate Court as to whether or not the 10th Article in the will shall be construed to require that the estate taxes extend to certain non-probate assets which were included in Mr. Dwight's gross taxable estate. Mr. Dwight in his will directed that all federal and state inheritance and estate taxes be paid out of his estate as an expense of administration. The Executors wish to have the Court decide whether or not they should pay estate and inheritance taxes on certain non-testamentary or non-probate assets. These assets might be in the form of insurance, joint tenancies, etc. In order to give an answer to this problem, I would have to study the New York law on apportionment of taxes. I assume that some of the other beneficiaries with substantial gifts are perhaps having their lawyers advise them on this problem. If you wish


to have me do research on this apportionment problem, I will be glad to do so. My guess is that the New York Surrogates Court will have the benefit of all of the statutory and court law on the subject, and that no further research or briefing is needed.

The Executors have also asked for instructions as to whether if the specified percentage of any beneficiary under Article 6 applied to the assets available for distribution under said Article exceeds the maximum amount payable to such beneficiary, the excess should be distributed ratably to other beneficiaries under Article 6 who have not been paid in full or whether the excess should be distributed in accordance with Article 8, the residuary clause.

An illustration of the last problem might be this. Article 6 (c) bequeaths 45% but not to exceed \$200,000 to certain beneficiaries. 45% of \$477,500 is \$214,875. The excess in Article 6 (c) would be \$14,875. The executors wish to know whether this \$14,875 shall be given to other beneficiaries under Article 6 who for some reason or other have not been paid in full or whether this excess should go into the residue. As a matter of construction, it is my feeling that this excess should go into the residue. I assume that there must be a residue; otherwise the executors would not ask for the direction.

I assume on this latter question, also, that the Surrogates Court will be fully advised on the law by the Executors and interested legatees. I do not believe that it is necessary for you to go to the expense of filing a brief on the law. I suggest, however, that inquiry be made of the attorneys for the estate as to whether adversary interests will be represented by legal counsel.

Pursuant to the terms of said decree, the amount payable to you is \$503.99.


We enclose herewith a form of satisfaction of decree which is intended to be filed in the Nassau County Surrogate's Court after payment has been made to you as recited therein.

During 1955, as a member of the firm of Spencer, Ordway & Wierum, I was in communication with you concerning the accounting by the Executors of the Will of Colonel Dwight.

I am now acting as attorney for the Morgan Guaranty Trust Company of New York, the surviving Trustee of a trust in the original sum of \$300,000, which was created by Article "Fifth" of the Will, for the benefit of the widow, Mrs. Anne H. C. Dwight, during her lifetime.

Although Mrs. Dwight still survives, Joseph C. Benson, who was a co-Trustee of the trust, died on November 15, 1960. Therefore, it will be necessary to have a judicial settlement of the account of proceedings of the Trustees, during the period from July 25, 1950, the date of the last previous settlement of their account, down to the date of Mr. Benson's death.

As in the case of the previous accounting by the Trustees in 1950, the intention is to include as parties to the proceeding, all of the legatees named in Article "Sixth" of the Will who did not receive their maximum legacies provided in said Article, owing to an insufficiency of assets on the final accounting by the Executors.

The reason for such procedure is because, after the death of Mrs. Dwight, some portion of the trust corpus may possibly inure to the benefit of legatees under Article "Sixth" who were not fully paid, as mentioned above. That would depend on the decision of the Surrogate's Court as to the proper disposition of any such trust corpus which may not have been disposed of by the provisions of Article "Fifth".

Although it will probably be several months before we are ready to initiate the accounting proceeding in the Surrogate's Court and serve you with notice thereof, I am writing to acquaint you with the situation and also to inquire whether there has been any change in your address as above. //
