"I wrote to Fred some days ago asking him to give you a letter to the tenant at Wilder notifying him of the change of ownership and telling him that you are representing us in the matter. I thought a letter from Fred to you would be quicker than sending me the man's name and address and having me write. I hoped so anyway. I told Fred that I would pay your expenses up there and the estate could share them with me when we get the returns. If you will let me know about what you need I will forward the cheque and as I said before you ought to add a reasonable charge for time spent. I am hoping to hear something more of the estate affairs now that Sept 1st is here.

P.S. We have just made the unpleasant discovery that the taxes on the Wilder farm have not been paid at all this year and there is a penalty of \$15.00 over and above the tax. This was of course my () in Fred's part and I think it would be wise to inquire into the Joliet taxes to be sure they are all right.

To Louis Hyde from J. R. Dwight, Sept 29, 1913

"The lease which I have from Joseph Kluchhammer is dated Sept 5th, 1911 and is a lease from March 1, 1912 to March 1, 1913 for 2/3 of all grain, veg & corn, corn to be delivered in crib on premises. \$2 per acre for all hay and pasture, 'First party to have option of either plowing back or paying at the rate of 1,50 per acre for as much of the premises as is now plowed for succeeding crop, said plowing to be an average depth of 5 inches.' I hope the paragraph above answers your question about back plowing. I do not see anything about renewal but suppose something must have been signed. I wrote Fred about it but of course have not heard.

To Louis Hyde from Jennie Dwight, Oct. 9, 1913

"I am sending the letter to Mr. Jarmouth instructing him to forward the money to you as soon as it is paid him. I shall write Fred that I have written to Mr. Jarmouth to do this and that I approve of your paying the Canadian taxes out of the proceeds of the estate's half if there is sufficient to do it. I think first however that $\frac{1}{2}$ the taxes of the year for the Wilder farm should come out of the proceeds of the crops. I wrote you I paid them only a day or so ago as we were notified the deed could not be recorded until they were paid. One half plus the premium is \$91.46. I am perfectly willing to send you a check for 69.54 to cover your expenses and thanks along with it, but if the rent is coming in soon it is all right to take it out as you say. However if there is going to be delay in getting it from Jarmouth please let me know. ... P.S. I do not think the proceeds from Wilder will cover all the Canadian taxes. I told Fred I thought you should offer whatever balance was due the estate to the Canadian land tax and perhaps he will be able to add the rent. I do not know though where he has any estate money coming from unless the Joliet farms.

"Your letter about Dr. Harwood is at hand and I hasten to reply to ask you if the matter could stand for a week or two and give Arthur a chance to talk it over on the ground. I appreciate the advantage of having someone like Dr. Harwood build on that property, and more so as I hope someday all the family will be out there and it will make a nice neighborhood. However I would like to have Arthur talk it over if you think Dr. Harwood can wait that long for an answer. ...

I received also your cheque for 285.46 on act from the Wilder Farm and also the cheque returned of mine to you for expenses, which you had already paid from the receipts. The taxes on the Wilder farm were for 1912 and a penalty of \$15 for not having paid them before June 1st. This of course should come out of the estate but I am willing to let it stand as a credit due me until we get the outside matters cleaned up. I am very anxious to hear some report of progress made in that direction. When you make a report of the Wilder money you will of course include the amount paid on the Canadian land. I shall say nothing about it until you have it all done. I think we agreed to share your expenses to Wilder but you can ask Mary and Anne about it.

"The only important thing was the Reed St. property and I want to tell you that in sounding Fred a little as to possible selling value, he said that Anne had expressed a strong desire for that place to live on. I told him that if Anne wanted it for any near future use that I would of course be only too glad to let her have it back and as I did was not feel at liberty to mention Dr. Harwood so let it stand at that. But I also said that if Anne did not want it for near future use I would strongly advise her to let me make what use I could toward the development of the farm property. You can take the matter up with Anne for if she wants it there is nothing more to be said. I would not in any way influen ce her against having it. I always have felt that the farm only needed the family to move onto it to start the opening up in the best possible way and if Anna should build in the corner we would open the road right away. On the other had I would very much like to have Dr. Harwood build there in case the family don't want to. You can talk it over but please, let Anne's real wishes are what I would like to follow. "I have waited to hear from Anne again and still do not feel very well satisfied about the matter of the Reed St. lot. I do feel that we could not do better as a family than have some one like Dr. Harwood build on that lot -- the only better thing would be using it ourselves, which at the best way of looking at it, seems remote. As it appears to be up to me to name a price for the lot I should say \$5000 (of course leaving the road) and I would move the house off. This offer is only to Dr. Harwood for home purposes. My idea would be to put the home on a suitable pièce ground farther up the road in the farm and plant that road nicely with trees. I would make the house a decent one if it stand the transfer so that it could be rented to the right kind of a tenant. I do not at all doubt but that the lot is a good one to hold for future value, but personally if it were not for the feeling that some one in the family might wish they had it. I would be in favor of starting the tide out that way as soon as possible.

I wrote Mr. Jarmouth I would like to get 80.00 for the Wilder farm and he wrote me that was a stiff price—he said he liked to see people boost prices for their land out there but inferred that I would benefit the public more than myself.

"Your letter and cheque is enclosed and I acknowledge receipt of some \$250.73. I paid \$167.92 on 1912 taxes in September which included interest from March when taxes were due. If you think best to apply the balance due the estate (\$104) on those taxes due me I would suggest letting the 34.77 which you refunded from the expenses of your Wilder trip apply on the taxes also. I am perfectly willing to stand the whole expense of that trip myself and would much prefer to have the back taxes as nearly cleared up by the estate as possible. It looks better that way and your going was a convenience to me. I will write Fred about the paving assessment and hope we can get the property divided on the assessors books as you suggest. Is it now up to the assessor to do so as there was a deed of division registered? I do not see why we should be liable as a whole having complied with the requirements as to separation

"Enclosed please find cheque for \$23.26 and I would be glad if you will attend to the assessment redemtion as soon as possible. It is not of course pleasant to think one could be sold for taxes in that way. I do not understand it. I have not received the Aug. gas dividend yet but as it is due about now according to former payments, I presume it is on the way.
