To the People of Dodge County

Having filed as a candidate for the nomination for representative for Dodge county, I consider it my duty to the voters of Dodge county to make a public statement concerning my position on the issues of great importance in the state and nation at this time.

Of the greatest importance is loyalty—the obligation of the individual to the government of which he is a citizen. This country is now engaged in a war with foreign powers and is straining every energy to meet the emergency in such a manner as to win victory with a minimum of sacrifice of human life. This is not a time for passive loyalty and every American citizen who is not now contributing his utmost is failing in his responsibility. Every other interest, personal or otherwise, should be subordinate to the interests of the government. Complete unity and harmony of action is demanded.

This country is not engaged in a war of conquest, nor for indemnity, nor for any selfish purpose, but we are engaged in a war waged against the powers of autocracy that freedom may prevail not only in the United States but thruout the entire civilized world. Freedom is the basic principle of our government and for which all the wars of our history have been fought. When Kaiser Bill shook the mailed fist of military domination in our face we were given the choice of maintaining a government "of the people, by the people and for the people" or to become a race subject to autocratic control of foreign powers by the rule of the sword. It is up to us to uphold, maintain and to establish forever the principles to which this government was consecrated by its founders and upon which rests the peace of the world.

For this purpose we are called upon to sacrifice our men—the life blood of our nation—our money, our efforts and everything possible to assist our armed forces to victory. As our national government rests upon the individual so must the individual contribute his full strength in this crisis. Any effort at this time which may divert the powers of our organized government from that purpose or which detracts from the full force necessary to meet this emergency is treason. Any organization which seeks to array one class of our people against another, which creates dissension at home or any condition detrimental to the powers of our government in the prosecution of the war

is an aid to the enemy and should be dealt with accordingly. Party interests have been cast aside and today all parties which are loyal to the colors are joining their efforts that the principles of freedom may not perish and that the peace of the world may be established in such a manner that the rights of small nations shall be safe from aggression.

Today it means more than ever before to be an American citizen. Citizenship carries with it not only privileges, but duties and responsibilities, the performance of which in the fullest measure is necessary to victory and to passing on to our children the heritage of freedom which was handed down to us.

To the end I pledge myself and my efforts and should I be honored with the nomination to represent the people of Dodge county in the legislature of the state of Minnesota my policy would be to contribute my utmost to every measure which would strengthen the arms of our national government to the attainment of an honorable peace, without respect to parties, persons or classes.

I am in favor of state-wide and national prohibition not only as a measure contributing to the successful prosecution of the war but as a permanent and abiding measure for the health, happiness and prosperity of our people.

I am in favor of granting suffrage to women that the wives and mothers of the nation may be admitted to the councils of the government under which they live and to participate in all the privileges and responsibilities of full citizenship.

I am in favor of universal military training along such lines as will place our nation in a condition of preparedness to meet any emergency, to uphold our national honor and integrity and to make our land safe from invasion or aggression.

National security—America one and undivided—America first—America last—America forever—is the only guarantee of the continuation of our state governments and therefore all measures or issues of state importance are only contributory to our central government. The next legislature of the state of Minnesota should be 100 per cent. American, united by the bonds of loyalty and free from domination or influences of any interest or class.

It is upon this issue that I ask your consideration and support and for the purposes of which I pledge my every effort.

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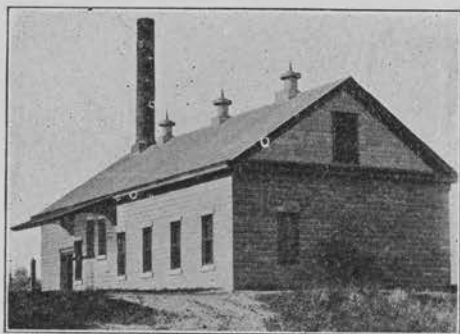

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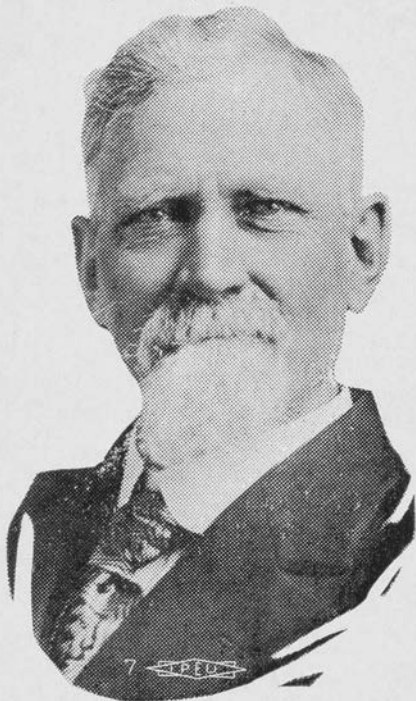
