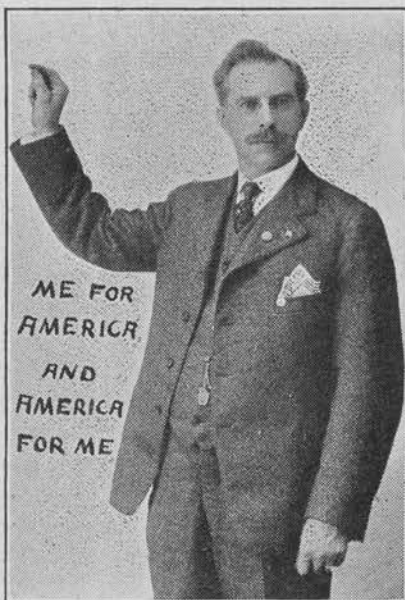
To The Voters of Anoka and Isanti Counties:

Anoka, Minn., May 22, 1918.

May I have your time and attention for just a few minutes while you read through this circular, because on account of both my business and my duties as Municipal Judge of the City of Anoka, my time will not permit me to go and see you all personally, much as I desire so to do. I will therefore in a very few words state to you the reason why I became a candidate for representative from this district (comprising Anoka and Isanti counties) and why I ask you to vote for me at the primary June 17th. In the first place we here in Anoka County conceded that Mr. Blomgren, the Senator from Isanti County, was entitled to a second term because he "made good." We also understood that he desired a second term. That being the case we of course knew that in all fairness Anoka County was entitled to and wanted the representative from Anoka County, and as I have been urged at several previous elections to file for either the House or the Senate, my friends now renewed their request with such persistency that I finally consented to become a candidate for representative.

They knew that I had for years been speaking, writing and voting for the principal reform measures which will come up for consideration in the next legislature, viz.: Temperance, equal suffrage and the adoption of the constitutional amendment, they knew that if it came to a fight (and possibly a close fight) for either of these measures or the adoption of the constitutional amendment, that they could not only depend upon my stand but that I have had years of experience in just such fights, and could hold my own in any debate or skirmish on the floor of the house or in committee.

Judging from present indications and from the conditions prevailing in this State and country, there will come up many important bills and questions in the next legislature affecting the people of this State aside from those just mentioned. It will therefore require men of both ability, experience and patriotism to properly handle and with judgment determine what proposed bills should become law and what should not. All classes of people both farmers, laborers and business men who know me, have been kind enough to tell me that they have the utmost confidence in both my ability and judgment to properly

represent them in the legislature, a compliment and confidence which I certainly appreciate. In view of these facts I wish to assure those of the voters in the district with whom I have not yet had the pleasure of forming a personal acquaintance, that if you favor me with your vote at the primary June 17, and I am elected to the legislature it shall be my constant endeavor to serve your interest to the very best of my ability, so as to make you feel proud of the day when you voted for P. J. Nelson for your representative. My experience in life has been such that I can understand and sympathize with men in all stations and conditions of life, as I have myself followed the plow on the farm, labored in the pineries, driven spikes on the railroads and shoveled on the streets of the cities, have studied and learned a profession and for twenty years successfully conducted business in four different cities in this State at the same time, have later studied law, and have been elected twice to the office of Municipal Judge for the City of Anoka, which position I occupy at the present time. People who know me best are kind enough to tell me that this varied experience and study together with my natural ability and good "horse sense" qualifies me in their estimation for the office which I seek. Finally, my dear people, let us remember that this is war time and that this country needs and wants every one of us to do our best in whatever way we can, in whatever line of work we are best fitted for, to help this government win this war, and if there ever was a time when the old admonition, "Farmer, take not thy hand from the plow," was applicable it is now, as every farmer has a specific and important duty to perform, as it is his patriotic duty to raise as large crop as possible and thus serve his country. But as I have no farm to plow and cannot go with the boys to the front, I may be able to serve my country in a small degree at least if you elect me to the legislature, and if there is any legislation that the farmers from this district want and are especially interested in, all they have to do is to let it be known to me in event that I am elected to the legislature and I will assure you right now that it will be looked after and presented in good and proper shape, as no man ever was or ever will be elected to the Legislature that is a better friend to the farmer and the farming interest than I am. You can take my word for that, however, under present conditions, with our country at war, and engaged in a life and death struggle with the mighty power of Autocracy I shall, if elected, deem it my first duty, and great pleasure to help with all of the 100 per cent of Americanism there is in me whatever legislation that comes up, which will back the boys at the front, back this State and Nation in a vigorous prosecution of this war against kaiserism and Autocracy, I therefore urge upon you all, no matter from what nationality you may originate to remember we are all loyal American Citizens now and nothing else and you can show your loyalty and patriotism by voting for P. J. Nelson at the primary June 17th.

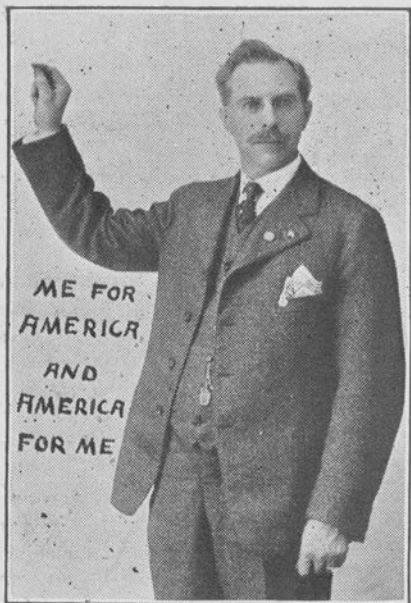

TO THE VOTERS OF POPE COUNTY:

I am asking the support of the voters of Pope County for the office of Representative in the State Legislature because I believe I have had the experience to properly perform the weighty and important duties of that office. I have due respect for the dignity of the office but shall always remember that I am the servant of the people and shall act accordingly. I shall let no undue influences, selfish motives, fear or favor, dictate to me. I believe in equal rights to all. I want to be a free moral agent of the people, knowing what to do and having the courage to do it. Thru my experience in handling of farm products I have acquired a knowledge of what is needed to get the products raised on the farm to the consumer in the most economical and efficient way. The producer is entitled to every cent that his products are worth on the market and I shall work for laws that shall prohibit the juggling of products after such products have left the producer. I believe that changes can be made in the inspection and grading rules of our government that will materially benefit the producers but that the great evil exists in the personalities of the men who are the inspectors and graders for

the government of our farm products. I shall work for laws that shall place our inspection and grading departments more directly in the interests of the shippers. Here is where I want to use the weight of the office of Representative to secure results. All faulty inspection and wrong grading must reflect on the producer thru his agency, be it a Farmers' elevator or independent elevator and therefore the personality of the men who are inspectors and graders must directly represent the shipper.

I hold that laws made in the interest of the people shall also benefit the people. I am in favor of all progressive legislation; such as state-wide prohibition, equal suffrage, good roads and the readjustment of taxes to the end that each individual shall pay according to his ability to pay.

I am very much against standing still; and going backwards does not agree with me. I believe in exerting a useful influence in advancing the great interest of all the people. It is in the belief that I am qualified to do as I have here outlined that I am asking your support of my candidacy for the office of Representative in the Legislature.

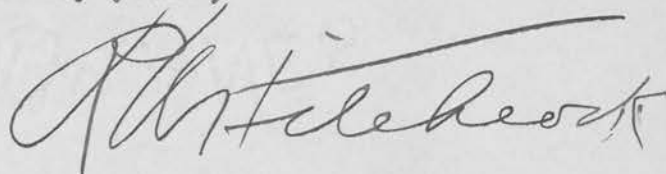

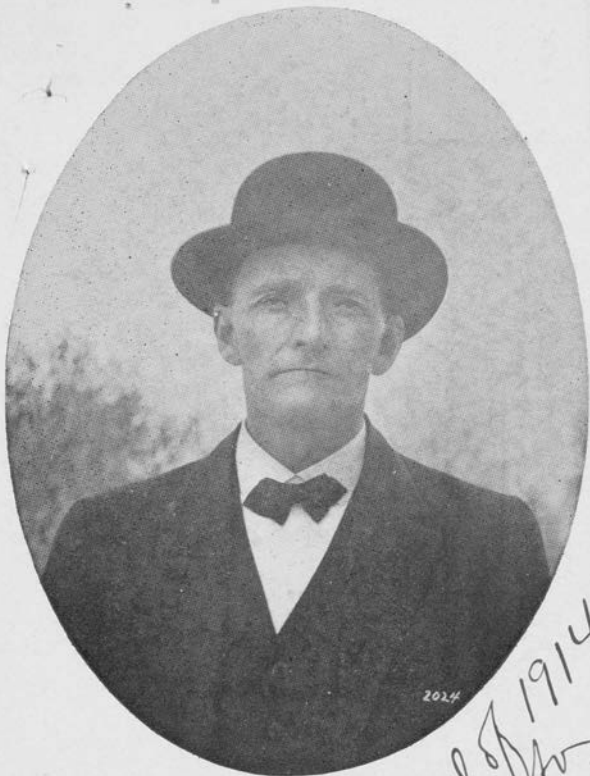

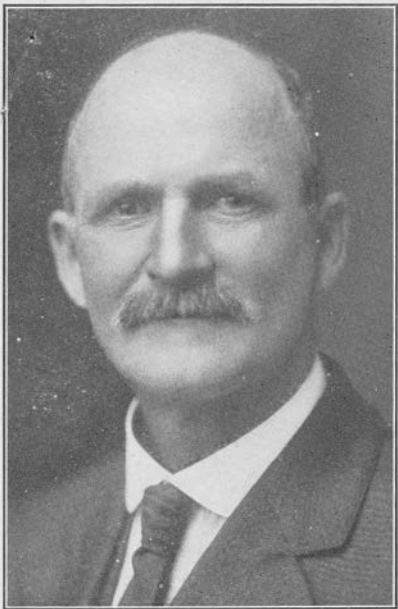
